Sausage Dinner Date Set

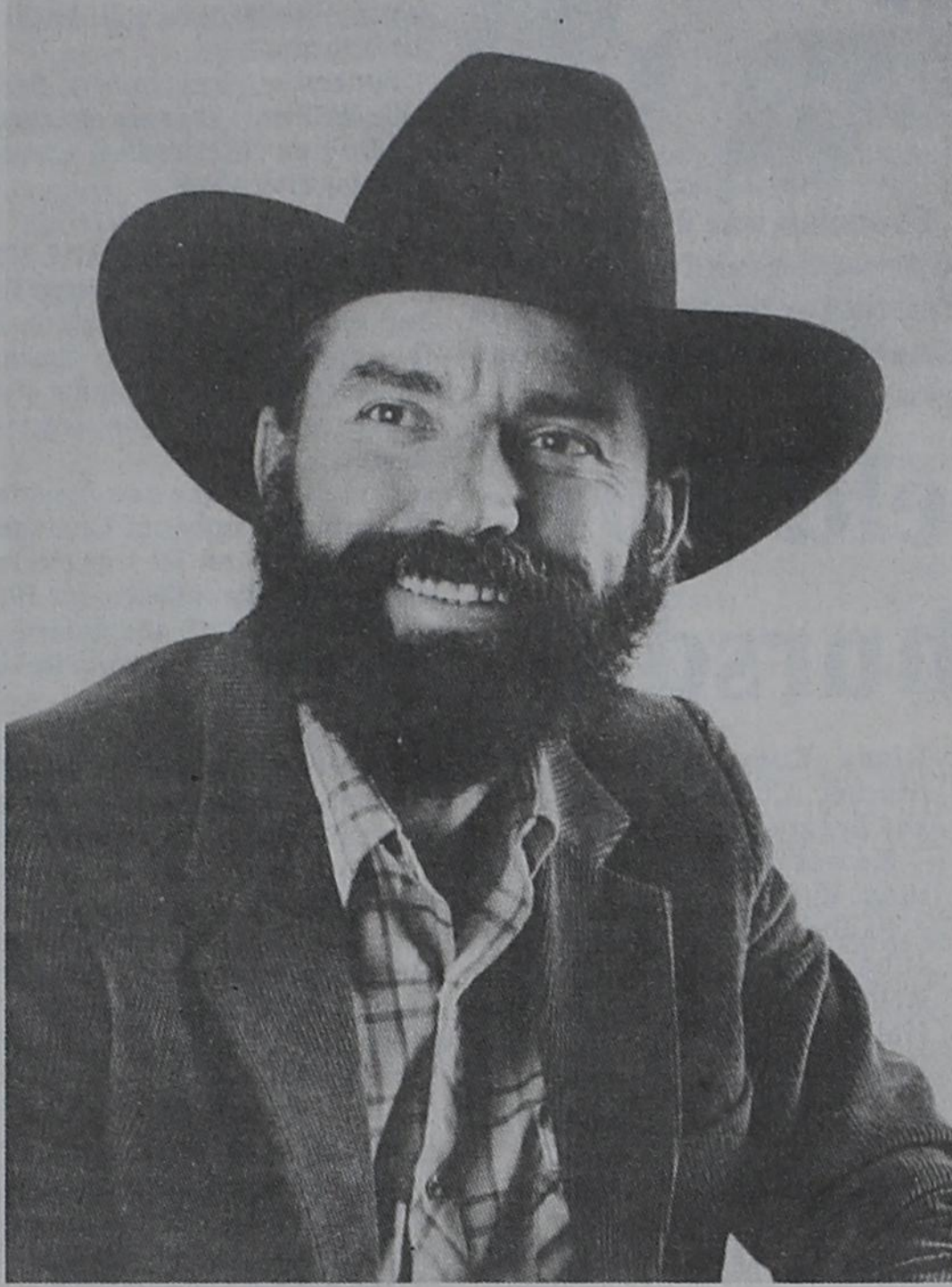

1990 Sale Hits Record High

The sale totals for the 1990 Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show hit what may be an all-time high, according to figures released this week by Dale Schueler of the Jr. Livestock Show Assn.

The grand total for the sale was \$87,314. Of this amount, \$82,303 was paid in premiums by the bidders, and another \$5,011 was paid by the buyers of "floor price" animals.

"It definitely was the best total we have had in several years, and we appreciate the support the buyers who made this possible," Dr. Schueler said.

Branson Wins Calf

When the flag dropped at the March 3 evening performance of the 1990 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, the scramble was on, as 28 FFA students and 14 unruly calves covered the 2.75-acre Astrodome arena with excitement. Shane Branson from Bovina, won an \$800 calf certificate by maneuvering one of the elusive calves into the winner's circle. The certificate, sponsored by the Kroger Company, will enable the youngster to purchase a registered beef or dairy heifer.

During the next year, Shane will raise the calf under the supervision of his agriculture science teacher.

Excel Foods Division To Close

The Excel Corp. announced Friday the permanent closing of its Excel Foods further processing beef operation at 900 Millard Ave., in Friona, effective May 18.

"Company operations in other states will supply the specialty products that have been made at the Excel Foods plant. Our Friona further processing operation is closing because workers compensation costs at the plant are an average five times higher than other states where we have comparable facilities, which makes it prohibitive to continue the operation there," said William G. Fielding, president of Excel.

"Workers compensation is a major concern at all of our Texas operations; however, the 1650 employees of the company's slaughter and boxed beef processing facility west of Friona will not be affected by the closing of the Excel Foods plant," he said.

Fielding said the 200 employees affected by the plant closing will be considered for transfer to other Excel beef operations. He said employees selected for jobs at other company locations will be offered relocation/incentive program and that the company is working closely with the Texas Employment Commission office in Hereford on out-placement.

Excel has produced specialty products at the leased Excel Foods facility since May of 1986.

The Bovina Junior High girls' track team opened its 1990 track campaign Friday in a dual meet with Lazbuddie. The Colts accumulated 249 team points to Lazbuddie's 140 points.

Coach Rundell said, "All the girls did super for their first track meet. We had some really good performances and gained a lot of valuable experience."

Bovina's 400-meter relay team of Darla Stormes, Ellie Bermea, Sally Noriega and Brooke Charles, sprinted to a first place victory in a good time of 58.47.

Bovina's distance runners also made an excellent showing. Melissa Perez was a double winner in the 800 and 1200 meter run. "Melissa had a nice, long stride and just ran super races."

Bovina's other distance runners, Elvira Talavera and Angela Beauchamp, also made improvements as they placed second and third, respectively, in the half mile.

The other dominating force of the meet was Bovina's hurdlers. Kimberly Kirkpatrick and Darla Stormes teamed up for first and second place finishes in both the 100 and 300 hurdles, respectively. Kirkpatrick set a school record in the 300 hurdles in a time of 58.56.

Brooke Charles ran away from the open 400 meter field as she won in a fast time of 70.90.

The only field event sweep of the day came when Bovina's triple jumping trio of Kirkpatrick, Celenda Young and Charlotte Quintana went 1-2-3 respectively.
