

New Videos Available on Weed, Brush Control

College Station, TX-Two new video programs about weed and brush control on Texas grazing lands are now available for viewing from the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

The program titled "Chemical Control of Weeds and Brush' provides an overview of how herbicides can fit into integrated range and pasture management. The tape covers benefits of control, broadcast and individual plant treatments, application timing and follow-up.

The second program, "Chemical

Control of Mesquite," details the chemical tools, timing and techniques to improve the degree and longevity of mesquite control. Follow-up measures also are covered.

Scenes in the two programs were taped in Bell, Brazos, Brown, Coryell, Falls, Freestone, Navarro, San Saba and Stephens counties.

Phil Davis, San Saba county Extension agent, demonstrates high volume foliar spraying of mesquite.


