ments. They have no eletricity, no clean running water, no sewage clean running water, no sewage
systems and very little food. Now those are poor people!
The so-called poor in America with the real poor in other countries. Our poor people have
television sets, washing machines, television sets, washing machines,
and health care. They drive cars, eat regular meals, and live in government subsidized housing with clean water and sewage system
provided. They are kept warm in provided. They are kept warm in There is no incentive for people to remove themselves from this cushy poverty status. When welfare recipients try to earn income on their own, they risk disqualifying
themselves from government themselves from government
assistance.

welfare mother with two children receives cash payments and non-
cash benefits amen cash benefits amounting to between $\$ 17,500$ to $\$ 20,000$ per year. The various benefits she receives include
housing, health care, utilities food housing, health care, utilities, food
stamps, commodities, and day-care for her children; all the things which middle class
pay for themselves.
I know college graduates who don't earn that much, plus they
have to pay taxes on their incomes have to pay taxes on their incomes,
while welfare recipients get theirs completely tax-free.
Of course, welfare benefits vary from state to state. Some are less than the figures given here and
some are more For instance in some are more. For instance in
New York and Washington, D.C., welfare benefits are equivalent to a job which pays $\$ 12.00$ an hour. Ive been in the work force for close
to 40 years and I've never earned to 40 years and I've never earned
that kind of salary. In some states, that kind of salary. In some suataces to
welfare benefits are equivalent to what a first year teacher would earn. unable to set aside a "nest egg" for their retirement years because they've had to pay for all the beats of society.
Our welfare system discourage work, penalizes achievement, and honors the millions of fathers who abandon their children. This liberal
system of government exhibits a system of government exhibits a traditional family, character and morals, in addition to taking about 40 cents out of every dollar the taxpayers can earn. Nothing will
change until welfare benefits fall change until welfare benerits
