#### LARGE-SCALE WARFARE NOT A PROBLEM

TOKYO, Sept. 18 (UP) - The nited States has enough guid-i missiles "immediately availabto launch large-scale button warfare in Korea, the Navy leading guided missile expert in the Far East said Thursday.

He said some pilotless planes could carry an atomic bomb

Lt. Cmrd. Warren A. Kurtz, commanding officer of the first guided missile unit to fight in the Korean war, said missiles already used aganst the Communists are "forerunner" of what will come. He said it is possible that "mis-sile-to-missile," and "continentto-continent" air techniques will

replace present-day dog-fighting and bombing by living pilots. "You can strike anywhere in the world with guided missiles and the first indication the enemy would have is when the plane div-ed down," Kurtz said.

He did not venture to guess how far along the Russians might be in their guided missile program.

"It is possible that the Communists have a similar weapon, but I can't think of any defense they can devise for it," Kurtz said.

He said none of the missiles launched from the carriers in Korean waters has been shot

The Navy has used obsolescent Grumman Hell Cats equipped with elevision transmitters and 2,000oound bombs for its missile program in the Korean war. They

have been in service since late August. Kurtz said these planes could e used in strafing, ramming other planes or bombing, as desired. "It is possible that a fleet of

guided missiles controlled by a single mother plane could be us-, ed in large-scale war in Korea," Kurtz said the number of guided missiles the Navy can use in
