



Everyone is invited to a forum to meet the candidates vying for three seats on the Bovina School Board.


The forum will be held Thursday, April 30, 1998, at 4 p.m. in the school cafeteria.

Bovina Still Has 911 Service


In last week's issue of the which stated that Bovina aldermen voted to discontinue a \$200 monthly payment to Friona for 911 service.

40 Yrs Ago-April 23, 1958 Vegetable planting in the Bovina area was given the starting gun this week, figuratively, and the cantaloupe seed are the first on the list for planting. Cantaloupe planting began Monday afternoon, about 6 miles out of Bovina on the Howard Ellison farm.

35 Yrs Ago-April 24, 1963 Mike Grissom, seventh grade student in Bovina Schools and son of Mr. and Mrs. Leon Grissom, is second best speller in the region. He won that honor in the Amarillo Globe-News Spelling Bee Saturday and by the width of an "i" missed a chance to go to the National Spelling Bee in Washington, D.C. Mike left out the "i" in pasteurization for his first and only miss.

30 Yrs Ago-April 24, 1968
Friona held the attention
of the Panhandle Saturday and Sunday as thousands attended the dedication services and open house for Missouri Beef Packers' new \$3.5 million packing plant. The operation is said to be the largest in the world, having a capacity to butcher in the vicinity of 2,000 head of cattle per day.

25 Yrs Ago-April 25, 1973 Santa Fe Railway workers recently put the finishing touches on the crossing gates at the east crossing in Bovina. Officials report that Santa Fe has plans to install gates at the Third Street crossing sometime this year or in

20 Yrs Ago-April 26, 1978 Mrs. Nita-Beth Dobbs and her son, Vernon, victims of the recent botulism epidemic in Clovis, were released from the BCMC in Albuquerque last Friday.

15 Yrs Ago-April 27, 1983

Frank Landry was the lone Bovina Mustang who qualified for the regional track and field meet as a result of the district meet in Olton last Saturday. Landry placed second in the 100 meter dash in a time of

10 Yrs Ago-April 27, 1988 Sgt. Billy Don Scott of Hereford stated, "In Parmer County, our troopers investigated no fatal accidents, five personal injury accidents, and three property damage accidents in the month of March. No one was killed and nine persons were injured in these accidents."

5 Yrs Ago-April 24, 1993

Diana Lumbrera, former Bovina resident who was accused of killing seven children, including six of her own, is being retried in Kansas for the smothering death of her four-year-old son, Jose Antonio. In 1990, a Finney County District Court had sentenced Lumbrera to life in prison for the May 1, 1990 death of Jose Antonio. But the Kansas Supreme Court last December cited errors in her original trial in Garden City, Kansas and ordered the new trial moved to another county to avoid pre-trial publicity.





Out Here

Thirty-two years ago today, April 24, 1966, was a Sunday. I spent most of that day in a place called the "Dad's Den."

Sounds like a bar but it wasn't but I wished it was before the day was over.

Dad's Den was the cute name of a waiting room at Baylor Hospital in Dallas. In 1966, dads had to

have a place to wait while moms were "back there in the labor room", getting ready for the next stop, "the delivery room" which was off-limits to everyone except mom, the doctor and the nurse.

Nowadays you can hold a family reunion in the modern "berthing rooms" if you want to and bring in a small orchestra to serenade the baby on its journey along the birth canal.

In 1966, dads read magazines, watched TV and smoked in the "Dad's Den", waiting for the nurses to shuttle out with progress

reports.

About the only thing you was the usually found out was the nurse's favorite medical description, "She's doin' jest

"But she's been in there for eight hours."

"I know, but she's doin' jest fine. It shouldn't be long

"Is she still screaming?"

"Oh yeah. But she's doin' jest fine.

On that April Sunday 32years-ago my firstborn daughter made her mother's life miserable for 36 hours and kept me waiting in Dad's Den so long I was reading the classifieds in the back of a two-year-old Field and Stream magazine.

I must have met at least a dozen other dads in Dad's Den. Most of them didn't have a chance to finish an entire bass fishing article before the nurse came out with the good news: "Congratulations Mr. Biffle,

it's a boy. Sorry Mr. Carr, she's still doin' jest fine."

I remember one dad who was there in the morning and came back in the afternoon to visit his baby. He had a fresh shower and smelled like Old Spice. "You still here?", he said in amazement as I scratched my board and scratched my beard and unstuck my underwear for the umpteenth time.

In 1966, lamaze classes weren't invented. Daddies were not allowed near the delivery room, much less having your entire grad-uating class as spectators.

As a matter of fact, it was the next day or two before dad could even hold the baby. You graduated from Dad's Den to looking through a glass into the

nursery while attendants corner of my bedroom. tried to match you with your

Because of the fear of germs, even relatives were kept at a distance from the little bundle. And mothers were allowed to stay in the hospital several days, not sent home within 12 hours like new mothers today.

My firstborn finally made

her earthly appearance at 4 p.m. Sunday. We brought her home Tuesday. Her mother would have stayed another week if they would have let her.

We named her Candace Caye Carr and called her Candee. We thought it would be neat if her initials were "C. C. C." Of course we spelled Kay "C-a-y-e" and Candy "C-a-n-d-e-e" so that no one else would ever know how to spell it how to spell it.

In 1966 cloth diapers had not yet become a museum item. I washed out plenty of them before flinging them in the diaper pail. After a day or two, the diaper pail took on an aroma similar to road

She drank out of glass baby bottles which we warmed in an electric bottle warmer with hot water in the bottom. At 2 a.m. in the morning, it seemed to take forever for the water to get hot enough to warm the bottle.

Car seats were not common, nor required by law. We held her in our lap when we went anywhere.

Her first pair of shoes were corrective ones. When they got too small for her feet, we cut the toes out so she could sleep in them. Today they are bronzed and Jones. I' take up a little shelf in the you today.

She started walking, then talking, and became a daddy's girl. Yes, I was a pushover. All right! A marshmallow too.

Most places I went, Candee went. Hardware store or barber shop, didn't matter. She tagged along after daddy and daddy loved

When she was seven years old her mother and I divorced. Instead of tagging after daddy every day, she had to settle for weekends and a night at the Old Spaghetti Warehouse every now and then.

For the next few years we would spend a week every summer together in places like Acapulco, Hawaii, or on a Caribbean Cruise.

I tried to be as good as I could but life got complicated. By high school she had other things to do and I had a new wife and two more kids.

She went to college at Baylor University in Waco where she met her future husband. They have been married eleven years and have three kids. The oldest

Seems like just yesterday little Candee sat in my lap at night and fell asleep. Seems like last week when she would come crawl in bed with us at night. She always climbed in on my side because she knew I wouldn't take her back to her own

It seems like a millenium since that day in the Dad's Den 32-years-ago. Somehow time and life have a way of

getting out of sync.
