Hord's creek, was for some years one of the dryest cities in West Texas. Old Lake Scarborough went dry, and Coleman shipped were named during a session of many months. Prices were high. and water was scarce.

Then Coleman's energetic leaders decided to erect a dam across Hord's creek. This cost lot of money, but re ent reports indicate that Coleman people made a good in-stment. The Coleman Chronicle in a front page story last week, announced that the new lake just above the dam, now contains some 3.300 acre feet of water. Broken down into life size figures, this means that Coleman now has approximately a thousand million gallons of perfectly good water

And what has been true and is true in Coleman, will be true in Eastland and Ranger. Our dam and lake, now under construction, is to be very similar in size to the Coleman lake, and once it is filled, most of us will never live long enough to see another water shortage here.

Both of these lakes have capac ities similar to Lake Worth.


