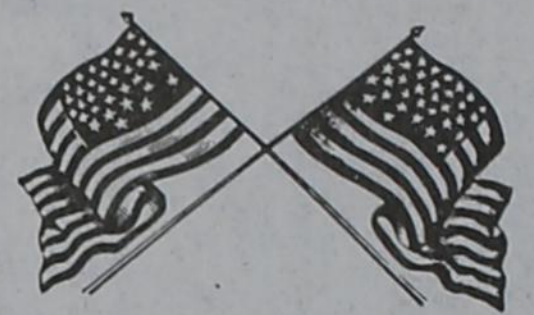

GENERAL ELECTION

City, County Favor Perry And Cornyn

In a good turnout for the "mid-term election," the city and Parmer County voters overall, gave resounding majorities to Rick Perry in his successful race for governor, as well as John Cornyn in the U.S. Senate race, in Tuesday's election.

In fact, Parmer County gave its support to every Republican candidate who was opposed in the election.

In Bovina's Precinct 201 (EMS Building), Cornyn led the voting with 131 (61 per cent) to 85 for Kirk (39 per cent). Cornyn won Precinct

303 (Ridgelea) 24-5 (83 to 17 per cent). He won countywide, 1454 to 455 (74 per cent to 24 per cent).

In the gubernatorial race, Perry led in Precinct 201 with 132 votes (58 per cent) to 94 (42 per cent), and Precinct 303, 26-4 (87 per cent to 13 per cent), enroute to winning the county totals, 1473-477, or 74 per cent to 24 per cent.

Congressman Larry Combest had "token opposition" from the Independent Party, and led Larry Johnson, 183 to 28 in the two Bovina boxes. He also led in early voting, 303-4, and in the county totals, 1678 to 85, a 95 per cent margin.

For lieutenant governor, David Dewhurst led John Sharp, 189-123 in Bovina, and 1236 to 692 in the county.

Greg Abbott led the attorney-general race in Bovina, 207-95 and countywide, 1415 to 458.

Carole Keeton Rylander was re-elected as Comptroller of Public Accounts, and the "one tough grandma" led Bovina voting, 232 to 72, and the county, 1547 to 332. Her winning percentage in the county was 82 per cent.

Jerry Patterson won Parmer County enroute to nailing the General Land Office commissioner's race, 2247 to 530 votes.

Susan Combs won re-election as the state Commissioner of Agriculture with 1459 votes to 438 for Tom Ramsay locally.

Michael Williams won the Railroad Commissioner's seat with 1301 votes here to Sherry Boyles' 508 votes.

Tom Phillips won the seat as Chief Justice, Texas Supreme Court, 1382 votes to 443 for Richard Baker.

Bob Craig won the seat on the State Board of Education, 1260 to 497 for David Schaeffer.

Republicans won all of the lesser state races, mostly judicial spots.

County officials running unopposed likewise were elected, as was Vi Hutto as Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2, with 219 votes.

Letter to Editor

Dear Editor:

As we remember our veterans on this Veterans' Day, let us set the day aside to honor our war dead. Not those of a particular division nor of a particular war, rather all those soldiers who have lost their lives in American wars.

How can we honor those who, by their devotion, and by the gallantry of their passing, have so honored our nation?

The most they would ask of us to do would be to remember them clearly in their great and generous youth, among their companions as a part of an American brotherhood, pledged to desperately hazardous adventure.

And this, indeed, is the least we can do.

Those of us who were in the fighting know well the meaning of "life in the combat zone." Those who did not come back with us would well wish that we not forget that they, too, were of our company.

Indeed, their sacrifices were the glory of our forces. They felt the heat, the rain, the sleet and the snow. The monsoons of Burma, the sandstorms of the Sahara were no strangers to them. The snows of the Ardennes foxholes, filled with icy mud; marches which carried them forward to deployment against a waiting enemy to offer again and yet again their lives, these were their daily portions.

The armies that fought at Belleau Woods, at Saint Lo, on the shoulders of the Bulge, thereby added brilliant pages to the history of American arms, were of this stamp.

In a democracy such as ours, there is no magic process which turns a citizen into a skilled and determined comrade. The moral qualities which a man possesses are not affected by the shift from

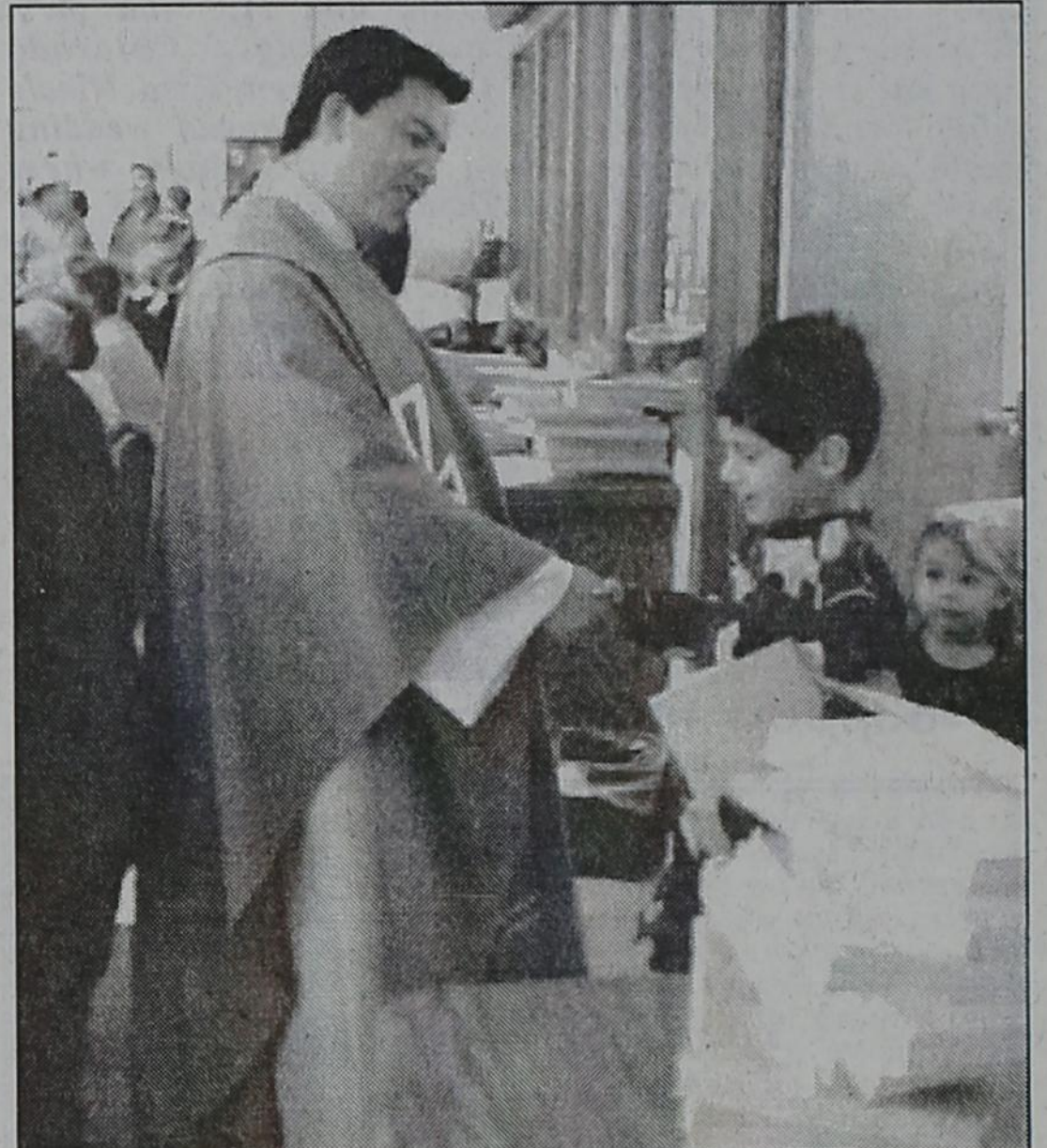
civilian to military clothing.

The men were what they always had been: American farmers, schoolboys, factory workers, and from the thousands of professions which make up America.

They had nothing to do with the events which led this nation into its wars. The

greatest wish of each was for peace and security and an opportunity to shape unrestrainedly his life in fruitful fashion in his own well-loved country.

But in this time of peril, he did not recoil. He sought

Bovina High School Earns 5-Star Rating

Texas Monthly magazine has published their second annual ranking of Texas public schools. The rating is

described by Texas Monthly as an accurate and comprehensive ranking of Texas Public Schools.

In their 2002 survey, the magazine employed the data crunchers at the nonprofit National Center for Educational Accountability. The magazine ranked 1,112 high schools and 4,500 elementary and middle schools. (All rankings can be found at texasmonthly.com).

Schools are ranked in economic groupings and measured on a variety of factors including performance on the TAAS reading, writing and math tests; the percentage of low income students; and the number of students taking advanced placement tests.

The four economic groups used for rankings are: highest economic group, upper-middle; lower middle; and lowest economic group. Bovina is ranked in the lowest economic group. Rankings of schools in the various groups are five-star for the highest down to one-star for the lowest.

Bovina High School, with a five-star rating, was listed as one of the top ten high schools in the lowest income category. Congratulations to the students, teachers and staff of BISD.

new point-total leader Jo Blackwell. She picked 12 correct and her tie-breaker guess was 18 points off. Jo also won first place in the Friona football contest this week.

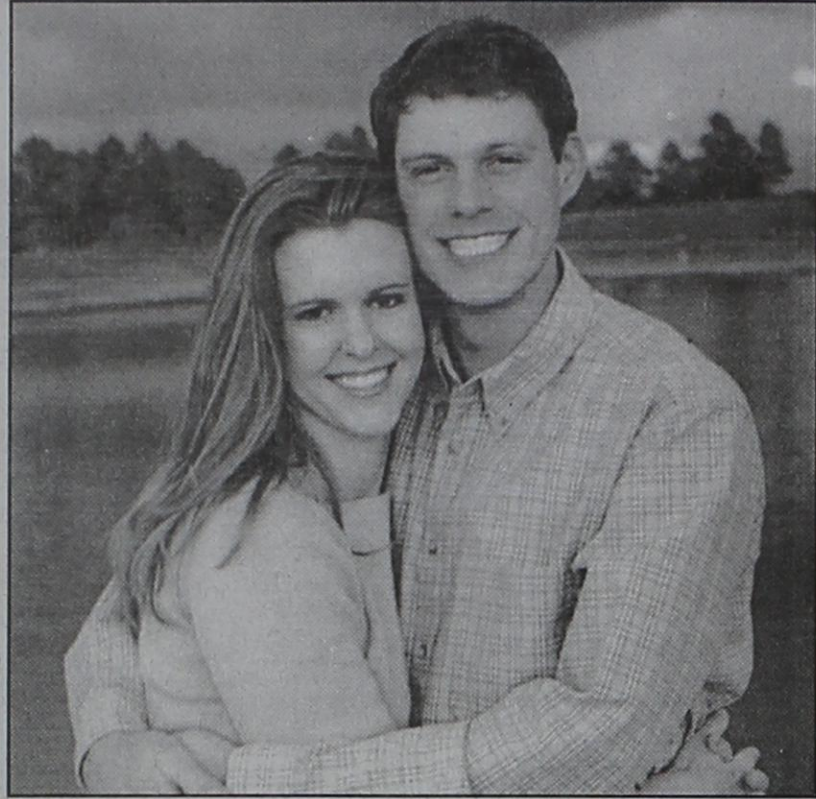

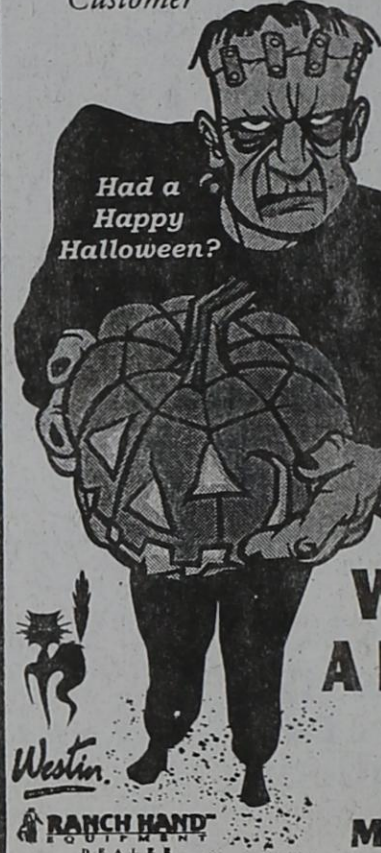
5 Yrs Ago-Nov. 7, 1997

A role which he reluctantly assumed, sufficient to beat out on the shields of his enemy a complete answer to that enemy's challenge to his people.

That his success brought world leadership to our nation was only a by-product of his labor could carry the accompanying burdens so gallantly and as enduringly a he had carried his own so long as America's sons were of the same rugged stamp and lasting worth as was he.

So, how can we do more than remember him clearly and cherish that remembrances"
