The first 16 entries will be \$40 per four-member team and the fee is due by May 17.



Does not the First Amendment insure freedom of speech and of religion, stating that the government shall not "prohibit the free exercise" of either.

leave their basic freedoms at the is presenting their valedictory or salutatory address and wants to mention God, their faith, or even pray, I believe they have a right to do so. I believe that right applies to all American citizens, Christian or otherwise.

The phrase, "a wall of separation between church and state," is not found in the U.S. Constitution. It was later introduced in a personal letter from Thomas Jefferson to a

group of Baptists.

We Baptists are very proud that the first ten amendments to the Inevitably, someone asked me Constitution, also known as The Bill of Rights, was included because Baptists insisted.

One of the first "done political deals" in U. S. history was when Virginia's Baptist leader, John Leland, promised to withdraw his candidacy to the Constitutional Convention and throw his support to James Madison. This was done on the grounds that Madison would insist on a Bill of Rights to the new U. S. Constitution. Madison agreed, was elected, and became the author of the Bill of Rights and the Father of the U. S. Constitution.

Church historian Hugh Wamble has stated, "Religious liberty and separation of church and state are Baptist gifts to the American people." (Hopefully, the present Baptists "in power," from both political parties -- Clinton, Gore, Ginrich, etc .-- will be so wise.)

The First Amendment, as I read it, does not forbid the influence of religion on government. Rather, it forbids the control of religion by A student, teacher, parent, or government. I do not expect Velma administrator should not have to (or any other elected official) not to be influenced by their faith (or lack school building door! If a student thereof) in God. After all, we are supposed to know what the candidates for public office stand for before we vote for them!

Reese AFB of Lubbock passed a major hurdle Wednesday morning when the base was taken off the closure list which was announced earlier this year.

In a telephone call to Bill Ellis, publisher of the Friona Star/Bovina Blade, Cong. Combest called the announcement a "major victory" for those fighting for the very life of the air base. "If that had not been done, Reese's fate would have been sealed," the congressman said.




