LOSSES HIGH **Area's Cotton Crop Takes Major Hit**



Plains begin planting cotton in early May. Roller coaster daily temperatures greeted their efforts this year. On May 18, the high temper-ature reached 103, but topped out at only 60 degrees May 20. Large temperature swings hamper heat loving crops such as cotton, which must accumulate thousands of daily heat units to make appreciable yields.

Boman said the only silver lining so far is the soil moisture. "The three to eight inches of rain we have received will help the surviving crop and any crop that we replant."

There is a host of information on evaluating damaged crops, making replant decisions and choosing catch crops to replace failed cotton on the Internet at: http://lubbock.tamu.edu.

With a new farm bill program under way, producers should check with their county USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) office to ensure their replanting decisions will not affect their program participation or program benefits. "It is also important for producers to destroy those failed cotton acres to eliminate any potential habitat for boll weevils," noted Stan Carroll, cotton entomologist. Producers who clean out failed cotton acres may be eligible for a credit on their assessment, but the possibility of a credit varies zone-by-zone.
