We are told that the earnings of this corporation during that month were practically \$12,000,000 net, and that checks were sent to members of the corporation amounting to  $12\frac{1}{2}$  per cent of their nominal subscriptions, or to \$25,000,000 in the aggregate, the syndicate being for the nominal sum of \$200,000,000. This is practically he return of the entire amount actually paid in, and more than his, it is stated on reliable authority that the profits of the syndicate are largely in excess of the amount actually paid in. This, it is estimated, would be considerably over 200 per cent on the investment. The question at once arises, how were these enormous profits made? Are they the legitimate results of honest business methods, or is there something terribly "rotten in Denmark?" To make a few dozen millions of dollars in less than a year may not be such an herculean task, but it will be hard to convince the people of the fact. The Attorney General of the United States is supposed to hold down or prevent the evil effects of corporate power, and if he has done his duty it is clear to the casual observer that the Government has not limited the privileges of corporations. But on the other hand, let a labor organization seek to secure living wages for workingmen, whether by questionable or fair means, and the Government promptly steps in and stops the proceedings.
