## A horrible death.

A Woman Mangled by the Cars at Trent Sunday Night.
One of the most horrible accidents in the annals of the Merkel Country occured at Trent Sunday night, in which a demented woman, Mrs. Howell, was run over by a train and her body ground into small fragments. From Judge Miller, who held an inquest over the remains, we learn the following particulars in regard to the sad affair:

For over a year Mrs. Howell had been slowly losing her mind, but was allowed to do as she pleased, as she had developed no alarming symptoms. Sunday night, or Monday morning at 3 o'clock she got out of bed and, it is supposed, wandered to the railroad track, but her absence was not discovered until the next day, the husband supposing she was somewhere about the house. A search was at once instituted and resulted in finding the body scattered along the railroad track for a hundred yards. It was only identified by the clothing. Perhaps a half bushel measure of flesh and bones was picked up. The verdict of the coroner's jury was her own hands and through no fault of the railroad company. It fault of the railroad company. It
was evidently premeditated suicide. Upon his arrival at Baird the engineer reported that his engine had run over something at Trent, but that he could not tell what it was and did not stop to investigate.
It is a horrible affair and one that has brought out the extreme sympathy of $t$ he community. Mrs. Howell left a husband and several children to mourn her loss. The remains were buried here Tuesday evening.
