

## "MY TURN"

WHO IS RUNNING this country anyway...the government or the media?

For the past seven years, we have had in the "Oval Office" the most popular President since Eisenhower. In spite of a lot of problems both at home and abroad, Reagan begins his last year in office only slightly less popular than he was in his first year of the presidency. Most presidents are not as well liked by the time they leave office, as they were in the beginning of their term, because the very nature of the office dictates that toes will be stepped upon and enemies will be made.

The three major networks set an extremely bad precedent when they decided not to show the President's "Contra Aid" speech the night before congress was scheduled to vote on this issue this past week. And, as you know, the issue as voted down.

President Reagan has, on many occasions, taken his causes to the people who elected him, asking their support for measures which he felt strongly were needed. The people then, in turn, advise their congressmen how they feel about the given issue. That is democracy in action. If the networks refuse to run the Presidential talks, this makes a very loud editorial statement. I suppose, the next time he feels strongly about a cause, the President will have to buy air time on TV in order to be heard.

Of course, the President could always write out his speech and send it to the newspapers. Most papers would probably be glad to print it, but most people would probably only read the opening paragraph. We have gotten used to having our news pre-digested for us and spit out in short segments on TV or in short headlines in the newspapers. This gives the "media" a lot more power over public opinion than it should have.

I will be the first person to stand up and fight for freedom of the press, but I firmly believe that it carries a few responsibilities along with it, and the "media" is definitely not living up to those responsibilities these days. A new term called "media bashing" has crept into our vocabulary of late; meaning "those anchor men are again digging up some vile doings on the candidates for public office." I think the public is getting a little fed up with media bashing and most folks were glad to see Vice President George Bush stand his ground with anchor man Dan Rather on a live interview last week. Since the interview was live, there was no opportunity to cut out the dig which Bush threw in about Rather's famous "walk off the set" a few months ago.

In spite of his popularity, I would not say that Reagan has been an extremely effective president. Kennedy was probably the last president who was effective in getting his programs across. And that was about the time the media began to get a real toe-hold on slanting the news their way. We haven't had an effective president since then. The President "runs the country" in name only, as the office has become one of a figure-head or diplomat. Congress and the press actually run the good old USA, not the President.

So, with that thought in mind, we could save a lot of headaches for the next few months by just ignoring all the presidential candidates and forget about the party conventions.

We could just pick someone who has had a lot of experience in the diplomatic service and put them in the oval office as our country's figure-head. But we'd better make sure we know who we are going to vote for in those House and Senate races. So we'll need to use a little reverse psychology and vote for the fellows who fare the worst on TV, since it will be obvious that those are the ones the media DOES NOT want in office.

# Mustangs Top Swifts, 52-50

Bovina's basketball teams split their games against Nazareth teams here Friday. The Mustangs scored a hard-fought 52-50 win over the Swifts, after the Fillies lost to the top-ranked Nazareth girls, 80-16.

The Mustangs avenged a loss last month in Nazareth, but it wasn't an easy task. Denver Riddle and Scott Scaff scored most of Bovina's first half points—all but two of them, in fact. Nazareth held a 16-14 lead after one quarter, but the Mustangs pulled to within one, 25-24, at the half.

Scaff had reeled off eight of Bovina's ten second quarter points.

This duo got some scoring help in the second half. Scott Sudderth, who has been slowed by illness, hit a three-pointer in the third quarter, but the Mustangs still trailed, 37-35, entering the final quarter.

Scaff hit a trio of baskets in the final stanza, and Matt Fox came up with two big three-point buckets, to help provide the winning punch. Scaff scored 25 and Riddle ten to pace Bovina.

The Fillies gained some consolation in holding Nazareth below the record level they had scored against them in January. While Nazareth jumped out to a 21-5 first quarter lead and 46-9 at the half, the visitors were held to 15 third-quarter points, which kept

them from eyeing the century mark.

The Fillies trailed 14-4 after one quarter. Jennifer Beauchamp's three-point basket highlighted the first quarter for Bovina.

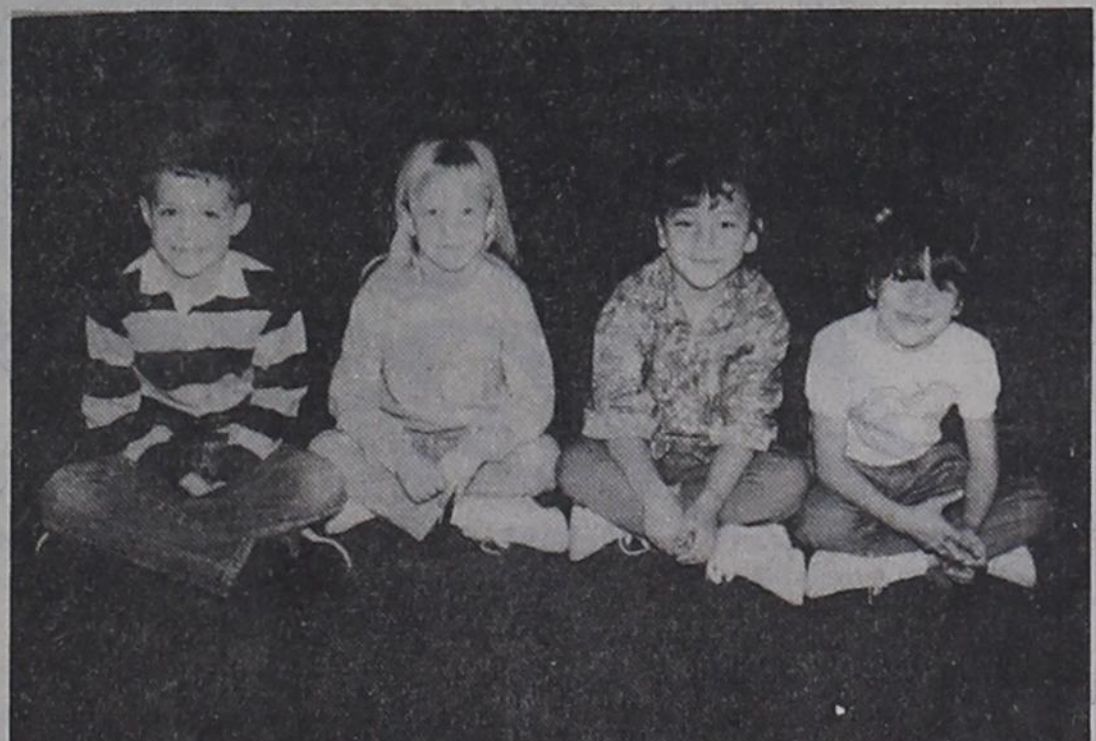
The Fillies held the Steerettes to seven in the second quarter, trailing 21-9 at the half.

# Bovina Showmen Do Well At Friona

Livestock showmen from the Bovina community did right well at the 41st annual Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show last week in Friona.

Local showmen did especially well in the barrow division of the show, getting over 50 per cent of their animals into the sale. Traditionally, the barrow show has always been one of the toughest divisions of the county show.

Best performance was by Todd Ware, who had the first place heavyweight Hampshire barrow. The pig also was named reserve champion of the Hampshire breed.

Also, Denver Riddle had a first place lightweight Duroc; Andy Stormes had a first place heavyweight Chester White; Leah Steelman had a first place middleweight crossbred and Randy Stone had a first place heavyweight crossbred barrow.

Otherwise, Jeb Bartlett had a second place lightweight cross; Ware had a second place middleweight cross; Jason Kerby had a third place lightweight Duroc; Jeb Bartlett had a third place light heavyweight Duroc.

Also, Darla Stormes had a third place light-heavyweight Hampshire; Glen Branson had a third place lightweight Yorkshire;

Bud Venable had a third place lightweight Yorkshire; and Shane Branson had a fourth place light-heavyweight cross.

In the lamb division, four Bovina entries made the premium sale.

Hippy Gomez exhibited the first place fine wool cross; Bob Dow had the second place fine wool cross lightweight lamb; Joanna Clayton had the second place heavyweight Suffolk, and Denver Riddle had the fourth place jumbo Suffolk.

Bovina had no entries in the steer division of the 1988 county show.

Ware's first-place Hamp barrow was the same animal which was judged as Grand Champion barrow at Bovina's local show prior to the county competition.

The premium sale seemed to produce better prices for the exhibitors than a year earlier, as most showmen received better than average prices for their animals.

The show was held on Tuesday and Wednesday, a midweek format, with the sale coming on Thursday. The change in format was made so that exhibitors who wanted to might take their animals to the El Paso show, which was on the weekend.

# Church Sets Renewal Series

The leaders are Eunice Schilling and Rita Villarreal, prayer network; Nancy Schwertner, Sunday liturgy. Key to the RENEW program and as a result of early tests of both concept and materials, is a small group coordinating committee headed by Joe Schilling. This committee

bears the overall responsibility for the selection, composition, and training of small group leaders. Recruitment for participants will be the responsibility of the Telephone, Sign Up Sunday, and Home Visit Committees, led respectively by Martha Nell Schilling, Joe Schilling, and Vernie Schacher.

Norma Villarreal will head up the Publicity Committee. Mark Schwertner will be responsible for the on-going evaluation of the program.

Titled "RENEW," the program's long-range goal is the building up of parish life. It's three goals are to enable people to preach and witness the word of God, to build community, and provide formation in the sphere of social justice.

All persons interested in playing need to attend.

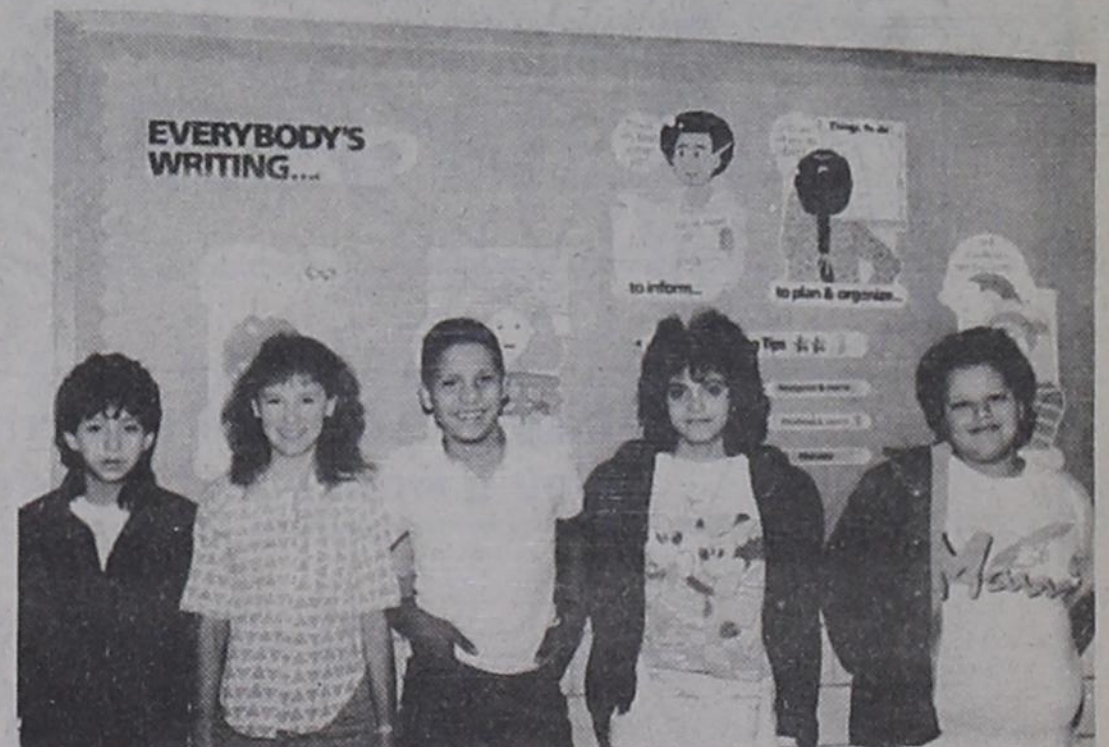
Anyone in grades 3-6 who are eight years of age before September 1, 1987 and are not over 12 by September 1, 1987, is eligible to play.

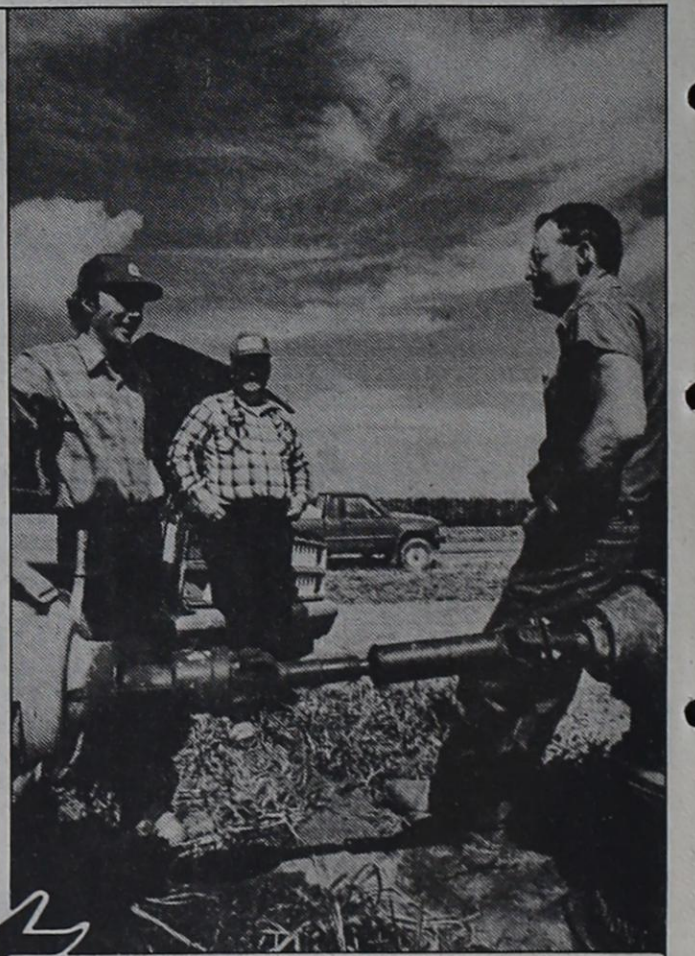

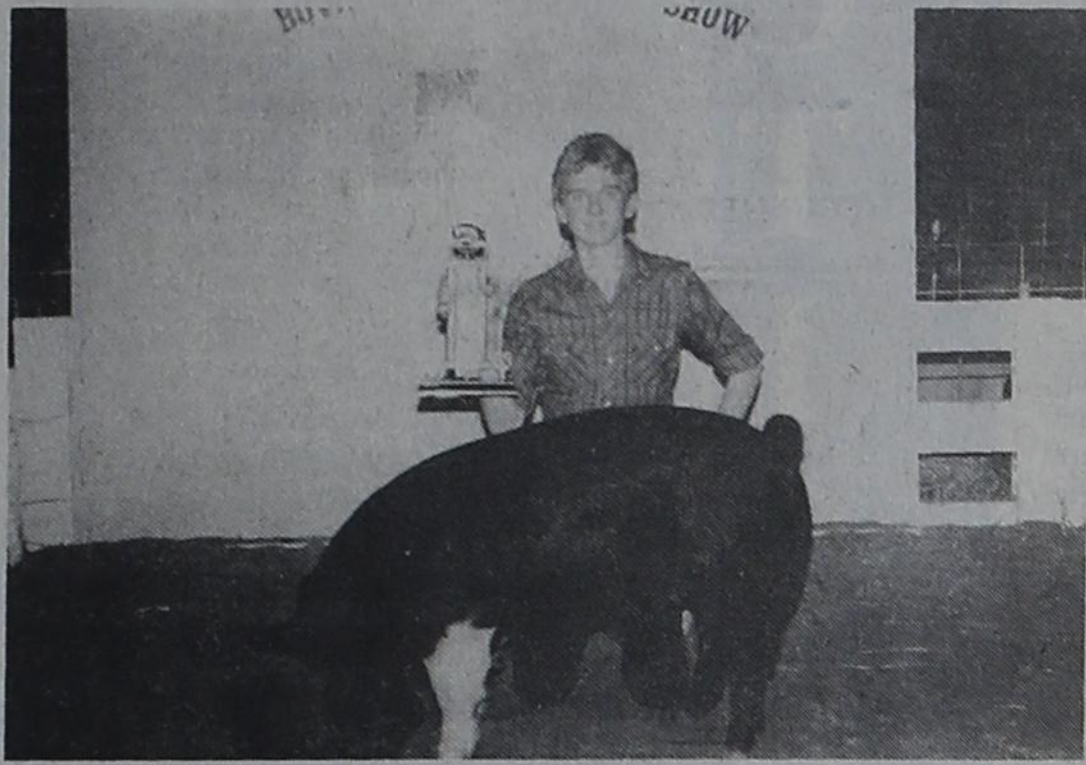

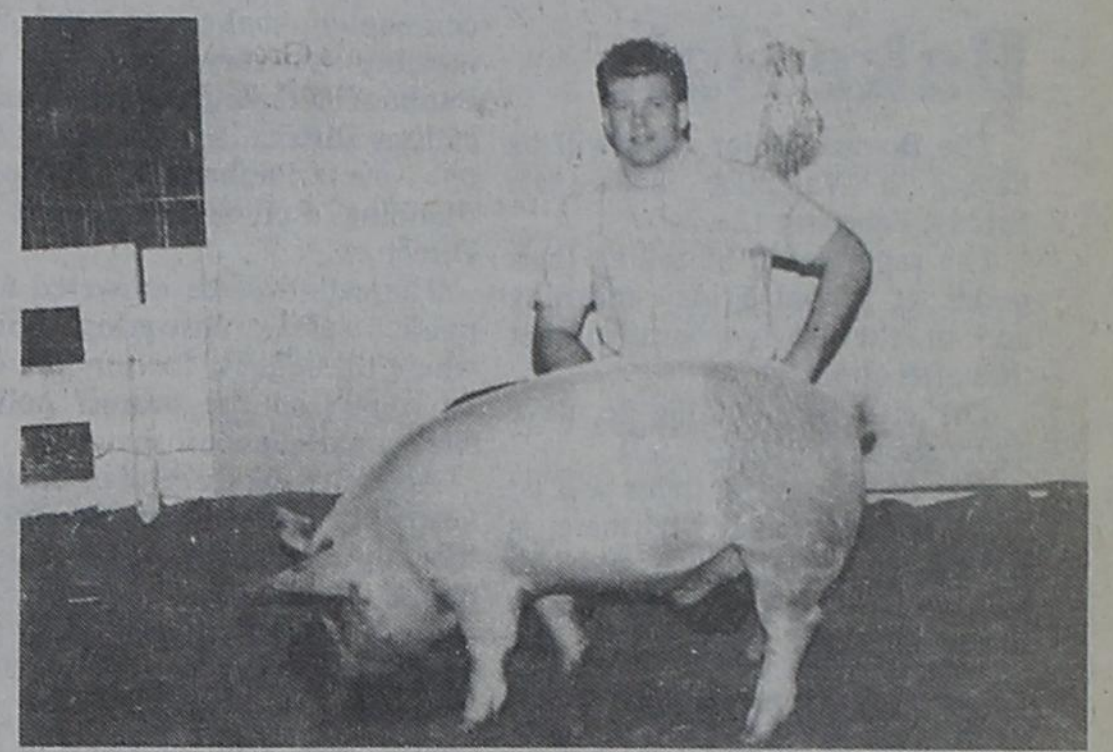

CHAMPION LAMB...Joanna Clayton poses with her lamb, which won grand champion honors at the local junior livestock show on Sunday.



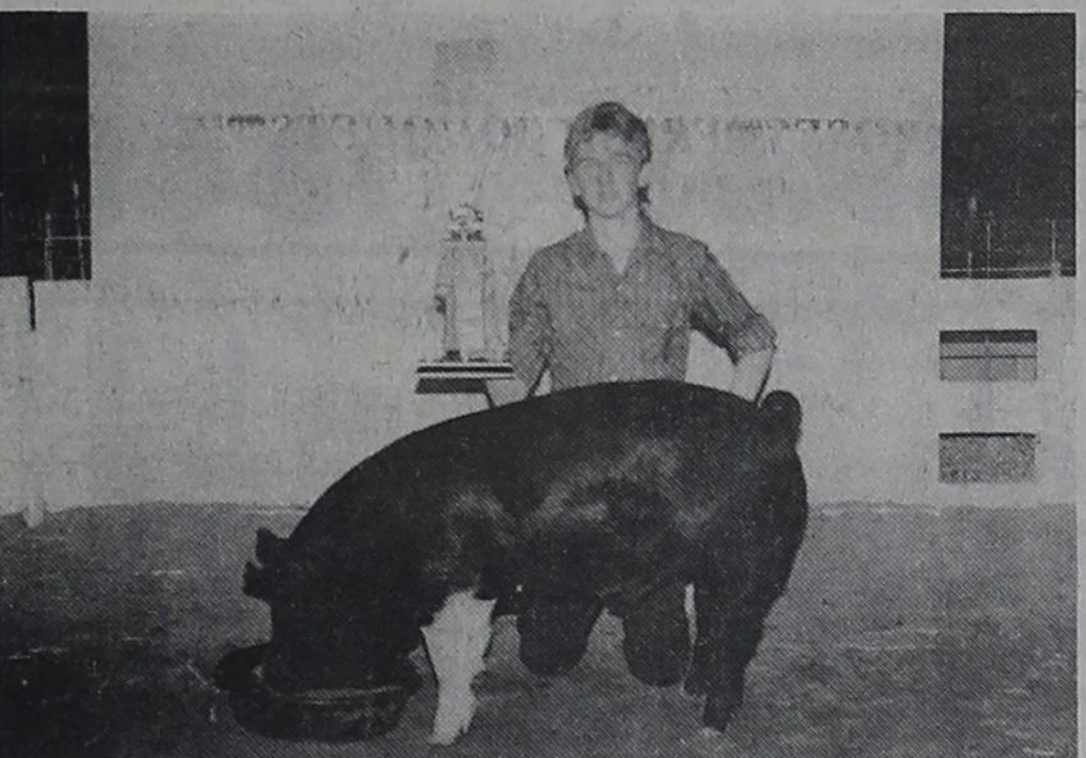

the region. They are Jimmy Ross, Briscoe County Judge; June Rhodes, Friona City Commissioner; and Jay Spain, representing the Hereford Fire Department.

They and representatives of the six Panhandle telephone companies make up the 18-member advisory board of the Panhandle Emergency Communications District, appointed last fall by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors.

The calls will be answered at a public safety answering point, where the request for services will be routed to the nearest police, fire, or ambulance dispatcher.

Access to the three-digit number keeps the caller from having to look up emergency numbers in a phone book. The streamlining could make the difference between life and death in many cases.

Twenty-three counties in the region have a direct stake in the establishment of the system. County and city commissions will be able to join the system and allow the telephone companies serving them to add a monthly surcharge to phone bills. Surcharge revenues will be used to purchase equipment and operate the system. The state emergency communications law allows up to fifty cents for the surcharge.

The most immediate challenge for Judge Ross and other members of the board is visiting each county commissioners' court and city commission to explain the program.

Precedent has already been set for 9-1-1 services in the Panhandle. The Potter-Randall County system will be in operation by late May.

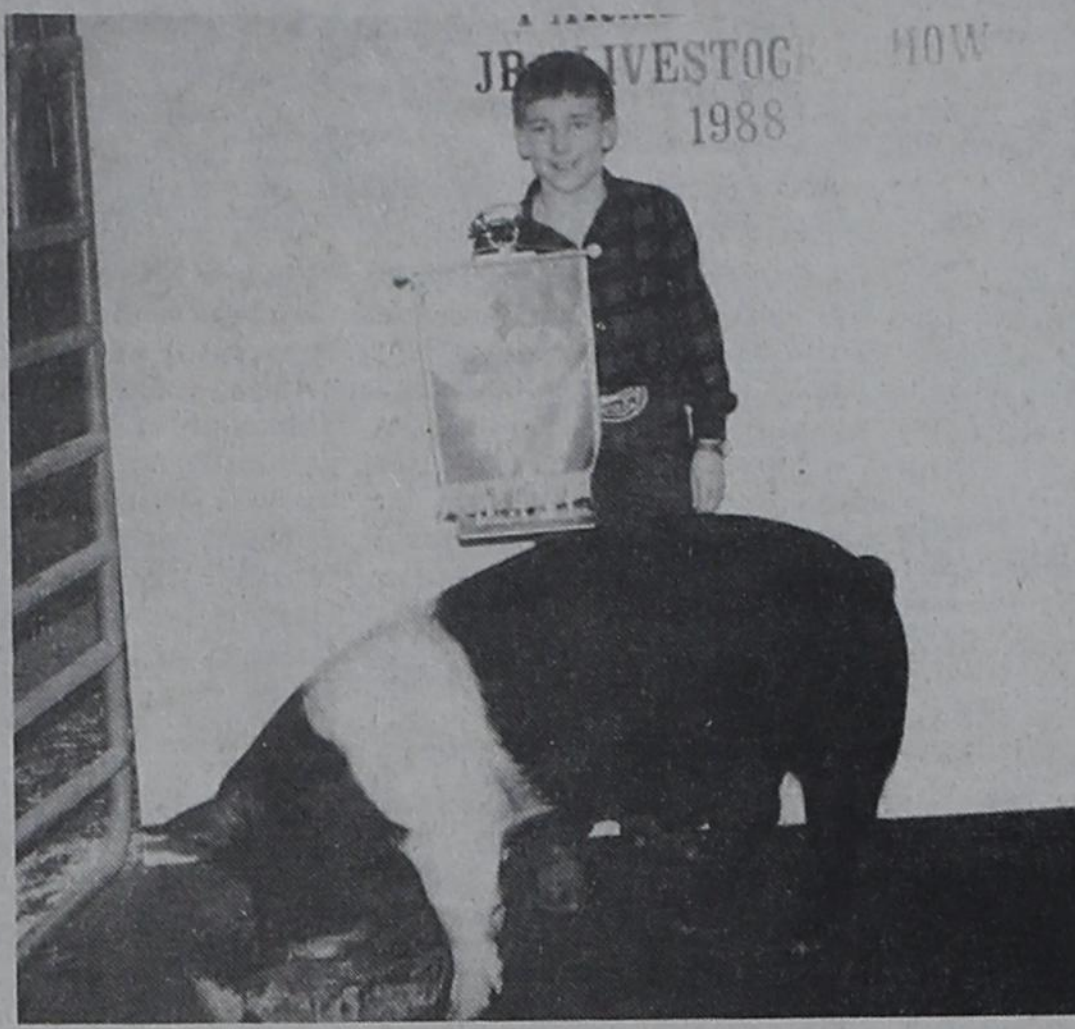

The proposed changes may become effective on February 15, 1988. Customers will not be immediately affected by this change except that the Commission will no longer regulate rates for monthly extension wiring and equipment leased by the Cooperative. Rates for local service (excluding telephones and other equipment) will not change as a result of this filing.

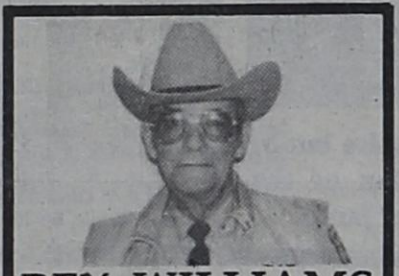

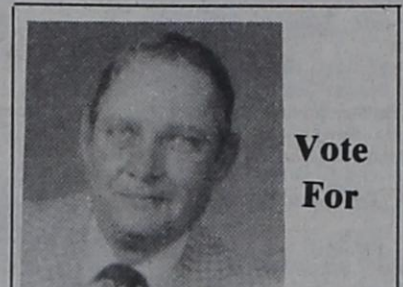

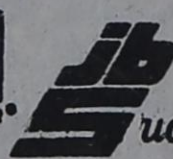
