Who were the free-thinking individuals who came up with such indispensable items as the ball-point pen, the zipper, the flushing toilet, scotch tape, the safety pin, the screwdriver and the toothpick, all the while his or her mother was saying, "If you don't quit wasting time with such foolishness as that, you'll never amount to a hill of

Young grew up at Kress, Texas. He received his degree in plant service in May, 1982 from West Texas State University in Canyon.



CLOUD FORMATION...A giant thunderhead is shown, typical of the clouds which have been building up across the area recently. The area continues to benefit from rains. good





The results of the basketball toss held July 4 were turned in and they are: age six and under--Corey Oliver made eight in a row to win a youth-size basketball.


Age 7-12--Roel Garza made ten in a row to win an official size Wilson basketball.


