Rt. Rev. Joseph M. Francis, bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Indiana, declares that the shortage of babies in the church Jan. 1, after which the usual is alarming and that the homes of weathier members of the church in Indiana have an average of only one Child to the family.

"Women in the finer homes do not want babies nowadays," said Bishop Francis tonight.
