Abilene, April 11.-The fore going is a copy of the last communication of Miss Mamie Farquhar, the eighteen year old daughter of J. T. Farquhar, living three miles south of Sambo Between nine and ten o'clook his morning Miss Farquhar took poison. She was found by her ather and brother in a dying condition. An empty strychnine o.tle and a dipper of waterwere near the bed on which shelay. A note was found under her breast. Her brother hastened to the nearest telephone to summon a doctor, but she was dead before he could get to the phone. Jus rice Keeble was notified and re paired to the scene of the tragedy $t$ once in an automobile, where he held an inquest. After ex amining the members of the fami$y$ and viewing the body he renered the following verdict: "I ind that deceased Mamie Farqu ar came to her death from stry hnine poison administered by herself with suicidal intent.'
