However, he referred to the past administration of the penitentiary system before it came under his direction and criticized the way the penitentiary affairs were sarried on at an unuecessary expense to the state. He defended his present administration, re citing the hardships he has had to undergo in order to give to the peop'e of Texas legislative rest
though he had very little rest himeelf for his opposition througb the entire term had undertaken any kind of rest at all.
Governor Colquitt exhibited the "bat" used in the peniten. tiary for the past years as an instrument of punishment to the conviets and whioh he abolished. He gave recognition of the criticism of his opponent in re gard to the financial matters of the penitentiary system and reminded his hearers that the sys tem was in debt, first as a result of the building of the railroad to Palestine during his predecessor' administration at a cost and al most total loss to the state o freeze which destroyed $\$ 300,000$ worth of cane and the fire which cost the state about the same amount.
In his speech at Abilene the governor made satisfactory explanation of the discharge of the confederate soldier employed in the pension department, stating that he received at least 100 letters in a week from old confederate soldiers complaining of the delay in receiving their check and that instead of purting in "third-class bartender out of a
fourth-class saloon"'he employed a young man who never attended bar in his life, the son of a Baptist preacher and a good prohibitionst.
The governor was presented with several beautiful bouquets by Merkel ladies and at the con-- folusion of his address was complimented by a great many who made his audiense. After the speaking Mr. Colquitt was accompanied to Abilene by a party spoke there Saturday night.

To the end that men may truly and justly govern themselves, democrayy must be maintained and, mind you, through the public arena may seem to be in Washington or Austin, its battles
are won or lost in the school houses do:ted all are won or
over the land.
Our national house-keeping has its beginning and its end in the masses, whether they will to have it wise or otherwise.
It is absolutely essential to the welfare and progress of our country that the people come to. gether more intimately-needful now as never before.
That the social center movement is nation-wide is teatified by the following paragraphs from speeohes deliverad at the first confer
University of Wisconsin last October:
"The future belongs to democracy," said J siah Strong. "The future belongs to the people and it is high time that the people should have in every neighborhood a university where the people may gain self-education for their high responsibilities
"There are many soores and hundreds of national gatherings in the United States in course of a year, representing religious commun ions, political parties, industrial interests; on the one hand, lator on the other, but che great gatherings represent special classes or special interests-the social center represents all
the people in all those interests which are som. mon to all.,
Another eminent educator, Geo. M. Forbess, says the social center movemert is "Educational in the sense that where there is human aspiration and joint efforts for better things-there is eduoation." The relation of this institution to the
community life as a whole must not be artificial or abstract, but vital, exercising real initiative, dealing with actual problems with a view to real betterment of community life. This is the institution of the social center.
Speaking of the movement in his own coromu nity, he said: "There was nothing in the expe rience of these clubs which so impressively brought home the lesson of real democracy as the appearance of public officials in response to invitations oxplaintion their dirt acts and the wethods of operation of tull opportunity for questions and anwas such full opportunity for questions and an-
swers as resulted in illuminating for the average man the whole field of their work and made him a muoh more intelligent and sympathetic critic of publio officiale.
"Every school building should be a neighbor hood olub house. No one could possibly estimate publio place of wholesome recreation, social intercourse, physical development, and the oppor tunity to combat the awful ignorance of the proptunity to combat whe awful gnorance of the proper conditions of wholesome living and social weil-
being through leotures by competent persons. I
am profoundly convinced that unless this or some thing like this can be given the permanence of a settled institution, demueracy as a permanent and effective form of government will be but the end of the rainbow of humanity's great hope and ageng effort, ever receding as we advance ", Hitherto the American has been, like the an oient German, so strong, so independent, so in

## ten important commandments.

Special Demonstrator Agent Peel desires the farmers of Taylor county to read and seriously consider Dr. S. A. Knapps' Ten Commandmente on Agriculture, which are as follows :

1. Prepare a deep and thoroughly pulverized seed bed, well drained; break in the fall to the depth of 8,10 or 12 inches, according to the soil, with implements that will not bring too much of the subsoil to the surface (the foregoing depths should be reached gradually)
2. Use seed of the best variety, intelligently selected and carefully stored.
3. In cultivating crops, give the rows and the plants in the rows a space suited to the plant, the soil and the climate.
4. Use intensive tillage during the growing period of the crops:
5. Carry out a systematic crop rotation with a winter cover crop on southern farms.
6. Secure a high content of humus in the soil by the use of legumes, barnyard manure, farm refuse and commercial fertilization.

Accomplish more work in a day by using more horse power and better implements.
8. Increase the farm stock to the extent of utilizing all the 'waste products and idle lands o the farm
and froduce all the food required for the men and the animals on the farm.
10. Keep an account of each farm preduct in order to know from which the gain or loss arises.

The demand of the public for more light and less heat in the consideration of proposed legislation is fairly illustrated by a resolution passed by the Henderson County Farmers' Union at Athens on April 18 which reads as follows
"Resolved, that we demand of our candidates or the legislature that they hear all sides before they may be asked to support and we insist that the farmer's side, as well as all other sides, be heard before and new laws are passed.
It has been the custom of candidates during the heat of a campaign to accede to any demand backed by votes, regardlees of its merits and as a result the farmers have suffered in common with all industry from hastily improvised legisiation. The Texas Welfare Commission is now throw ing powerful sunbeams of intelligence on our economic affairs. Let there be more light and less heat in law making.
