## whes of farm laberers increase.

The Farmers' Union has been making a com parison of the condition of farm laborers with other olasses of laborers in Texas and in the the union in discussing the subjeot said:
"The nation has been shooked to find young women reoeiving wages under $\$ 8$ per week, but did you ever stop to consider that the farm labor er works for less money? The legislature has just placed an eight-hour law upon the statute book but did it ever occur to you that the farmer works from sun to sun?
'The farmers' union is in sympathy with the working girls and in favor of the eight hour law and we atand for fewer hours and better wages for all who toil, but how about the farm laborers? There are more men who labor on the farms of Texae than in all other occupations combined."
Acoording to the report of the federal census bureau, farm wages in Texas average $\$ 1900$ per month with, and $\$ 2730$ per month without board. Reduced to a weekly basis it means that the farm laborers of Teyas get $\$ 600$ per week where they board themselves and in many instances they have a family to support on this sum. The farm owner cannot increase the wages of his hired help and "shift the burden" to the consumer as is ofton the oase with the merchant ard the manufacturer. He does not fix the price of his products and while producing the wealth of the nation, he reoeives minimum pay for his services. Over production and orop mortgages force the farmer into ruinous competition with each other, forcing down prices and compelling low wages and long hours. The remedy lies in organization and in oo-operation in marketing.
In Texas 160,538 farms of the 417,770 employ help at an annual expense of $\$ 25,685,000$. During the past ten years farm wages have increased $\$ 4.97$ per month.

In Taylor county there are 2,404 farms and 1,020 of them employ \$136,221 per annum
