but Alderman Willtams raised objection to the contract of the city em bodied in the franchise as to the reg a body deferred action for further consideration. According to the term outlined the matter of improvemen in the system for Merkel was left entirely in the hands of the company and there was no regulation possible
on the part of the city.

BROWN MUNOEEER 15 NOW ON TRAL

Dallas, Texas, Nov. 3.- "O Lord Jesus I am too young to die and my life has been filled with too much trouble," The last words uttered by Miss Florence Brown, ringing in his ears, caused Meade Barr to confess to her murder here last July. Acsording to inormation secured today
"I often wake up and find my self trying to wash her bloo from my hands," Barr says in his confession.
A charge of murder "by aiding tting Meade Barr', has been filed against Mrs. Ellie Lake, a young widow, with whom Barr claims acquaintance Information charging murder, was filed against Barr several day ago.

## Barr's Contession

Barr's story as he has told it the grand jury and to the officers, is as follows.
On the morning of July 28th he entered the offiees of Robinon \& Styron on Field street, just at the time when he and his
alleged accomplice had figured hat Florance Brown would be alone. He found her alone, and when she refused to open the safe, beat her into insibility with wo revolvers. After she had allen to the floor unconscious, he took his pocket knife and ut her throat
Then he walked to the front of he offioes with his hands on both pistols, expecting to have to ill someone in escaping. No one as near, so he walked calmly own Field street to Commerce and down Commerse to the Ori-
ental Hotel. There he took a outh belt car to the entrance to Fair park, where he met the wo man who he aljeges planned the crime.
The two walked together to the T. and P. tracks where they parted, Barr proceeding down he track to where he caught a freight train to Texarkana. From there, he says he went to Little Rook, where he stayed a day, going on to St. Louis.
says Woman' Planned Crime.
Barr says the woman planned the whole orime, deolaring the notive being to get $\$ 1500$ which he had learned in some mysterous way was in the safe of the asl estate office. According to Barr's story, vely as she told her story.
which he tried to make the wo
man corroborate they planned to divide up the money when they met at Fair park and later to get married. Barr says he had one 38 -calibre revolver and a 45 in his pockets when he entered the office. One of the guns was
given bim by the woman, he claims, but he failed to get her o admit this by his questions. She denied that she ever had but one gun, and says she disposed of this before she ever knew Barr.
Barr told the jury that the woman was personally acquainted with Miss Florence Brown, and she urged him to get the money and kill the girl if necessary to get it.
'Didn't you tell me to kill if ecessary, and when I started killing not to stop?'" Barr asked of the woman, pounding on the able.
She said "No," and turning to
the jurors, said: "Do you think I could sit here and deny this whole thing if I were guilty, as he says I am?"

Developements in the Brown nurder case took \%an unexpectedly dramatio turn late Saturday ight when Mrs Ellie M. Lake, residence Grand Avenue, was placed in the county jail follow ng the filing of a complaint gainst her by Chief of Detective Henry Tanner. This complaint was not made publio but it can be positively stated that it did not connect Mrs. Lake directly with the killing of Miss Florence Brown. Meade Barr, brought rom Indiana, testified before the grand jury Saturday night. Folwing his testimony, he was hisked from the court room by Sheriff Brandenberg, Chief of Police John W. Ryan and Chief of Detectives Tanner. He was placed in an automobile and the three officers and the man went whizzing over the viaduct osensibly bound for parts unknown. An hour and a half later Sheriff Brandenberg returned to he county jail with Barr. Seeing a reporter there he left with the prisoner and it is not definitely known whether he is in Dallas or not.
