Those lucky enough to be selected by the computer to receive tickets fo the Dallas concert were to get their tickets two days ahead of the concert.
Those living 400 miles away had lots of notice as to how to plan their weekend, didn't they?
The ticket applications were made several weeks ago. The Jackson prometion promises to refund th "within four to six weeks." That's where the scam comes in.
Reporters following the entertain ment business say the Jackson cashed all of the money orders
immediately, and while their fans will eventually get their money back, they will have the use of this pile of cash estimated to be as much as 1.2 billion dollars, for a couple of month
situation estimates that the Jacksons should make in the neighborhood o $\$ 16$ million on this investment, fro their Dallas appearance. And this i OVER and ABOVE what they wil make on the concert itself. Now, if this isn't enough to mak your kid's cassette, how about som more?
The money order had The money order had to be newspaper advertisements. But in th newspaper advertisements. But in the height of arrogance, the Jacksons
told newspapers they had no intention of paying for the ads. The newspapers were to print advertisements free, or not at all. Tulsa, Topeka, Wichita and St. Louis told the Jacksons to go jump in th lake, but all three daily newspapers in the Dallas-Fort Worth area ended up running the ads. They justified thei move by the fact haa they would sell thousands of extra copies containing dangerous precedent.
That's not all. The Jackso management is asking for fre stadium rental in their appearance including the Cotton Bowl and the 'Thodome, told the Jackso Cotton Bowl manager told them it would not be fair to other promoter to do anything different for the would receive a percentage of the sales of merchandise, but not from the Jacksons.
About all Texas Stadium and th Ab of irving is getting to keep, three concerts, is the profits from the food and drink concessions. Oh yes they have also raised the parking fee $\$ 5$ for the event.
