## YOUHH IS SLAN NEGPO ARFESTEO

Waxahachie, Feb. 28. - A speech by Rev. A. C. Parker, pastor of the Christian church, averted a lynching here this morning and furnished the police
with information which may lead with informat in Dallos or Fort Worth of two or more negroes, believed to be implicated in the brutal murder of Jack Jones
white, 22, here some time las night. 9
The body was found about 9 Jackson's garage, where Jones was employed. The head was crushed in by a piece of gas pipe and there were indications that the murderers had made a hurried search of the garage for The y of value.
The young man had evidently been murdered near midnight Saturday night. Hearing a noise in the hall, he had stepped out in his night clothes and had been attacked. Walls and floor showed traces of a terrible and bloody struggle, the body being horribly beaten and stabbed, the head
and the skull crushed.
After a search of After a search of about an
hour, the police invaded the home Joe Lockett, negro, where some bloody clothing was found, and the black broke down and made a partial confession, deny-
ing, however, that he had killed Jones.
When the news of the arrest spread about the town a mob formed near the jail and took the negro from the officers before they could put him in jail. A rope was thrown about the black's neck and he was dragged to the cotton compress platform, when Facing the meb of determined Facing the mob of determined doomed negro the preacher - appealed to their better sense and urged them to disband and abandon their plan of lynching. He spoke for fully fifteen District Judge Lee Hawkins, ttorne Dearborn and Coucrs told the mob that if they lynched the black it was probable his accomplices would never be captured.
