STORMY SESSION GREETS ORGANIZATION THE UNITED STATES HAS STARTED NEW OF COMMERCIAL CLUB MONDAY EVENING



Parcel Post

I would enlarge it to include all express business. It is understood (1) that all express property would be purchased at a fair value; (2) that all railroads thereafter be properly remunerated for any incident increase in the mail business, and (3) that all worthy express employees may pass into the Postal Department without recourse to the civil service laws.

This enlarged mail service in co-operation with the Federal Agricultural Department would revolutionize the distribution of farm products. Market prices would be posted in the postoffices. Eggs, butter, milk, chickens, vegetables, fruits and a thousand other things for which city people hunger would find ready and good market.


