The Taylor County commission ers' court probably established a record this week when it allowed bounty on a total of 18,371 jackrabbit scalps, so far as is known the biggest number any
county has ever paid bounty on at any one time. The safe fund was exhausted
last month, but Taylor County commissioners decided to allow the usual bounty for anothe month out of its own purse. Thi snonth is out and there The sum of scalps.
The sum of $\$ 918.55$, a nickel apiece, was paid out for rabbit
sealps. There were 37 wolf scalps and 10 wildeats on which bounty was claimed at $\$ 2.00$ each. E. was Berry turned in six wolf and three wild cat pelts, while C. R. Lindsey was second with fiv wolf pelts.
In the matter of rabbits, S. T. Tucker was first with 1320 , J. A Duckett second with 1085 and Hardy Bonebrake third with 937 . Durning the entire season Rev.
E. S. Tucker of Tye claimed bounty on 1483 rabbits. There were 155 separate bounty ac-
counts allowed by the court this week.
