FEDERAL APPROPRIATION FOR MERKE

Congressman Blanton Introduces Bill for the Appropriation of \$12,500 for Post Office Building for Merkel. .

The following bill has been introduced by Congressman Blanton looking to the appropriation of \$12,500 for the erection of a post. office building in this city:

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Unitd States of America in Congress assembled, that the Secretary of the Treasury be, and is hereby, authorized and directed to acquire for the United States in the city of Merkel, Taylor county, in the State of Texas, in such manner as to him shall seem best, by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise, a suitable site and cause to be erected thereon, according to plans and specifications to be approved by him, a substantial building, including fireproof vaults, heating and ventilating apparatus, and approaches, with good, modern conveniences and improvements, for the United States post office, agricultural extension service, and other government uses, at a total cost of not more than \$12,500.

This is good news for Merkel. No city is more worthy of an institution of this nature. Coming just on the eve of the formation of a live commercial organization, we confidentally look forward to better things for Merkel.


