### JUDGE OVERSHINER RE-PLIES

Merkel Mail:

I notice your article in the Mail making certain criticisms of me for not alloting a helmet to Merkel in Victory Liberty Loan. In the first place I am glad that you blame me only as ground of this complaint, for I would willingly suffer ostracism, martydom or most anything else rather than estrange the friendship existing between Abilene and Merkel, I wish to assure you that I accept full responsibility for the distribution of helmets and as a representative of the whole coun ty did my best to award the helmets in accordance with the instructions and principles governing the Victory Loan campaign.

In the first place I had only nine helmets to distribute. The nineteen were all sent to me but followed by a letter from Mr. Frank M. Smith, Federal District Director of the campaign directing me to deliver half of them to the Chairman of the Woman's Organization.Of course it was not advisable to cut one of them in two and I delivered ten of them to Mrs. Dallas Scarborough, Chairman of the Woman's Organization, who demanded half of them. The Woman's Organization is organized from Washington, is separate and distinct from the men and is in no wise under my control.. As to how they distributed the helmets, the chairman of their organization can speak for herself if she so desires.

These helmets were offered as an inducement at the beginning of the Victory Loan campaign for work in this campaign and I had to bear this in mind in making the distribution.

The towns and individuals doing the largest part of the work and getting the best results, I think you will agree with me, should come first in the award of these helmets.

The bond salesmen of the three banks in Abilene, namely, W R. Keeble, J F Garrison and W H Free, sold the largest amount in the bonds, the sales of the least of the three amounting to more than \$40,000. Of course all of these sales were not made

Washington, May 26 .- Total subscriptions to the Fifth Victory Loan were announced by the Treasury as \$5,249,908,300, an over subscription of nearly \$750,000,000.

### Bankhead Highway Signs To Be Erected

Birminham, Ala., May 26.-The Bankhead National Highway Association, at its Third An nual Convention in Minreal Wells Texas, April 18th and 19th after considering a large number of signs and offers of signs marking companies, closed a contract with the National Highway Marking Association to mark the Bankhead National Highway from Washington to the Pacific Coast, a distance of over 3500 miles.

The signals and signs are made of reinforced concrete with colored concrete emblems. The word "Bankhead" appears on each signal in colored concrete. All signs and signals are to be mounted on concrete posts. The Bankhead National Highway will be the first great trans-continental highway to be marked from the capitol at Washinton to its destination.

Few people give serious consideration to the destructive habits of rats. Of course, they are a nuisance and should be destroyed is the verdict of the average man or woman, but the real enormity of their offences have not been fully realized, for if they had every effort would be expended to insure their destruction.

Rats carry bubonic plague and many other diseases fatal to man and have become responsible for more untimely deaths among human beings than all the wars of history.

It is estimated that rats and mice destroy crops and other pro perty each year in the United States valued at over \$2000,000, 000, while the value of the grain they eat and waste on many farms would more than pay all the farm taxes.

People have been fighting rats in a listless, careless manner for a number of years, but failure has resulted because of lack of organized concentrated effort.

Start now and make a systemmatic campaign against the rats and mice and drive them from the farm and home. Do not be content to leave a few, because a pair of rats breeding uninterruptedly and without deaths would, at the end of three years (18 generations) be increased to 359, 709, 482 individuals.

Get your neighbors to join you in an organized effort to eradicate these pests, since a few pair from the neighbor's home may soon restock your place.


