plying these figures to a city of approximately 20,000 population out of 486 deaths, 200 were from preventable diseases. The people of such a city are losing annually from work, school, etc., an aggregate of 200,000 days, or
550 years in time, and $\$ 214,800$ 550 years in time, and $\$ 214,800$ in earnings. About 5000 school
children are losing 25,500 days from school, the equivalent of keeping 141 of these children out of school altogether. The employment of an alltime Health Officer, said Dr. God dard, State Health Officer, working in cooperation with a
local Health Board and the State Health Department would reduce these figures at least 25 per cent. For a city of 20,000 pop ulation this would mean an annual saving of $\$ 53,700$, and the prevention of 40 deaths In view of these facts, the State Health

She District Peak Commo has a twenty cent tax for school purposes which last year a mounted to $\$ 241.36$; their scho lastic enrollment was 31 , which gave them an apportionment of $\$ 221.26$. Their total amount of school funds for the year wa $\$ 463,01$.
The Attorney General has ruled that where a District has tax of less than fifty cents on
the $\$ 100$ valuation increase in said tax is rejected by the vot ers of that Discrict, the existing tax can no longer be legally collected.
This year the above Distric had a scholastic enrollment of 22 , which will give them a State Approtioll the finds anch for that school in case the pro posed tax is lost.
In case said tax and bond election carries, said District will receive in special tax upon the same valuation as last yea $\$ 603,40$; State Apportionment $\$ 157,30$; State Aid Approximate \$1,110.70 in school funds avail able for the coming year
