BUILDING THE ROADS

Mr. Rollin J. Windrow, State Highway Engineer, has prepared atable showing the estimated val uation of taxable property in Texas for the next forty-four years, based on the increase made during the past twenty cording to local officers. years, although, as a matter of fact, the increases are much greater at this time, and promise to continue to be so for some years to come, than they have lever been.

On this basis of voluation, he has worked out the rate of taxation for seventy-five million four and one-half per cent serial bond

to be issued five million dollars

It is an astonishing fact that the highest rate ever reached on this basis will be at the end of the fifteenth year when all of the bonds shall have been issued, and which rate is twelve and onerate for the entire period is six and one-half cents on the one hundred dollars valuation.

It is, therefore, clearly shown in case the entire 75 million dollars should be issued in 15 years miles southeast of Merkel, which yearly on a single automobile.



Washington, Oct. 20.-Steps to prevent abnormal increase in the price of sugar because of the existing shortage were taken today by the department of justice Attorney General Palmer notified beet sugar refiners, who have been withholding their products from the market until the price situation became more stab ilized, that the United States sugar equalization board had determined that 10 cents was a fair price to be charged the wholesalers and that the charge in excess of that amount would be regarded in violaton of the food control act.

Refiners were asked to telegraph their concurrence in this price, which would mean that they would put their supply on the market immediately, thereby relieving the present stringency.

The price to the wholesaler heretofore has been 9 cents so that the new price means an increase of one cent a pound. Retailers have been allowed to charge 11 cents a pound for controlled sugar under the old price, while the department of justice and the sugar board did not state what the new retail price would be, it was assumed that the increase would not be greater than the wholesale advance.

This chart shows why your electric light bills are higher some months than others. It shows too why your bill for November. will take a considerable jump.

Remember, the clocks will be set back one hour on October 26th. That will mean an hour's longer use of electric light on October 27th and thereafter.

But regardless of this change of time, the average use of electricity in a residence during the Winter months is nearly $41/_2$ times as great as in the Summer months.

There are other reasons, too, why your bills in Fall and Winter are larger than in the Spring and Summer.

When Summer is over-vacations are over-everybody is home again; more rooms are occupied; more light is needed.

The outside cold keeps us indoors more; the soft cozy glow of the electric light makes reading a pleasure.
