He would figre his price on a legitimate profit basis and yet could undersell the mail order house. He advertised to the customers of the Plainview country to make out their orders for the mail order houses and bring them to his store and dise they were buying the identical merchan se they were buying, the same brand and cost than the mail order house and eliminate he long wait for freight shipments and also affording the purchaser the opportunity of ex mining the merchandise before taking it.
Many were skeptical of this offer but at first a few ventured in and tried this plan. They were convinced and a great accomplishment was brought about in the encouragethose who had never weighed the matter before began to realize that they were being obbed by the mail order houses. This is mere $y$ an ezample of the fact that the mail order business is one of the things which tears down and destroys the building of a commercial center.
There are many other reasons why every ollar possible should be spent at home. ty would never send a dollar away from home if he could get the desired articles at home. But aside from this fact the writer wishes to show some reasons why every loyal citizen of Merkel should buy from Merkel merchants. For example take the cotton grower.There are many cotton growers who send money out of Merkel and Taylor county to the mail order nthoughtedly and in many instances they do t without thinking that they are tearing down their own commercial center. Again the local mercant deposits his money in the local bank. When the farmer needs money for the handling of his crop he goes to
the bank and gets it at a nominal rate of inthe bank and gets it at a nominal rate of in-
terest. In fact he is again getting the advantterest. In fact he is again getting the advant
age of the use of his money for which he has lready received value in merchandise anceady received value in merchandise.
All of these thngs the mail order man wo against. He does not pay one cent of revenue nto the city. He does not assist in the main-
tainance of the school system and he would augh at the ruralite whow ould ask him for oan of some money with which to make another crop in order to buy more merchandise ot so with the Merkel merchant. He will extend credit when credit is needed, while the
mail order man saps the country of its reve nue. Hence the writer feels no hesitancy in be ing responsible for the statement that the in dividual who sends money out of town for merchandise he could buy in town is a traito to his city and country, from a commercial tandpoint.
On the other hand the merchant has his part to play in this development. He must
carry a line of merchandise which will accom odate the needs of the people. He must sell it at a profit which will enable them to buy it and must give satisfaction. The investigation mide by the writer of the Merkel stores gives grounds for the statement that these institutions are adequate for the needs of those living in this community and would as a whole be a credit to a city several times the size of Merkel and merit the patronage of
