## RELATING TO TAXATION BY SCHOOL DISTPICT <br> Senate Joint Resolution No, 17

Proposing an amendment to Section 3 of Article VII of the as by exempting independent and common school districts from the limitation of a total tax of one dollar on the one hundred dollars valuation for any one year, and making an appropriation thereof.

there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem state tax on such an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred $\$ 100.00$ ) dollars valuation, as with the available school fund arising from all other sources,

support the public schools of this state for a period not less than six months in each year, and it shall be the duty of the State Board of Education to set aside a sufficient amount out of the said tax to provide free text tending the public free schools of this state; provided, however, that should the limit of taxation herein named be insufficient the deficit may be met by appropriation from the general funds of the State and the legislature may of school districts by general or special law without the local notice required in other cases of special legislation; and all such school districts, whether created
