



### **A LEGISLATORS VIEWS ON** EDUCATORS SALARIES

The following is a letter to the Tyler Courier-Times, from Representative W. D. Swann, who also lives at Tyler, in which that gentleman states his position with regard to the cut in salaries of the faculty of the Texas State University. Representative Swann is a brother of Mr. J. S. Swann of Merkel.

I am in receipt of a telegram from the Rotary Club at Tyler to vote against any cut in appropriations for Education.

I have no means at hand to know who the men are that compose the Rotary Club at Tyler, but I am persuaded to believe they are men who toil not neither do they spin, but are arrayed in purple and fine linen and fare sumptuously every day.

I shall preface what I shall say that I am heartily in favor of education, but I think the money collected from the tax payers of this state ought to be equitably devided amongst all the institutions of learning in the state. I think every boy and girl should receive a common school education at the expense of the state. The only way to accomplish this great object is to cut the salaries of the teachers of the higher institutions and appropriate the money to the rural schools. This is our only change to aid the rural schools as we have gone to the constitutional limit on Taxation already.

Having heard a full investigation of conditions as they exist in the University, I think I am better position to know how ould vote on questions that e up in the house than my ple at home who know but le of the question at issue. 
