

NEWS SENT BY HELIOGRAPH

Only Method by Which the People of Montserrat Can Learn of World's Happenings.

The TO,000 inhabitants of Montserrat get all their tidings from the outside world by the flashing of mirvors from the island of Antigua, 27 miles away. The wireless and cable do not touch this mountainous and isolated pinpoint on the map. Mail posts are infrequent. The natives anust depend almost entirely upon the heliograph-an instrument used extensively before the telegraph was invented, which means "writing with the sun."

The messages are flashed from a mirror headed into the tays of the sun. The mirror operates from side to side, and in that way the dots and clashes as they are flashed are "picked out" and formed into words and sentences. The United States navy still uses a similar system for some signaling work.

During the war Montserrat was forbidden the use of the heliograph. Too many submarines were lurking an West Indian waters.




