During the next fifty years there were as many as 22 public Thanksgiving days appointed in Massachusetts, usually in October or November after the gathering of the harvests, or to celebrate some public benefia. It did not become a regular holiday until a long time afterward.

In 1789 Washington issued the famous Thanksgiving proclamation reccommending Thurs day, November 26 as a nationaday to be devoted to prayer and Thanksgiving. Washington's ex ample was followed by cler Presidents.

In 1863 President Lincon ap pointed the fourth Thursday November as the nati Thanksgiving day. Since the day has been obse nually without inter

#### LIGHTENING FLASH. PICTURES BODY

This mirror which bears the shrouded body of a woman, formerly hung in a negro cabin near Marshall, Texas. On that night a severe electrical storm took place and during the disturbance a flash of lingten ing caused the room in which the body of the dead woman lay to light up with a peculiar bril liancy.
