parties allowed the voters in recent years to mark their ballots for the presidential nominees. That was in 976, when Jimmy Carter and Walter Mondale were the front runners for
the Democrats, and Jerry Ford and Ronald Reagan were leading the Republicans.
Texas voters, by and large, horoughly enjoyed this manner of indicating their preference in the the 1980 primary came around, the system had been changed back to the old style, where a handful of voters in each precinct can decide how the elegates will be divided.
Personally, we think it's time for he century changes again), and allow each voter to make their choice in the presidential nomination.
Not only is this a more fair way of running the system, but it also should
make for a larger voter turnout on the primary dates.
