Campaigns will be conducted in 20 heavy cotton counties in West Texas which already have a large membership in the organization. Simultaneausly with the beginning of the work in the blackland territory, field workers will be placed in Hall, Childress, Hardeman, Cottle, Little Barger; Foard, Knox, Dickens, Dawson, Scurry, Fisher, Jones, Mitchell, Coke, Tom Green, Concho, McCullough, and Haskell.

The organization forces new operating in Taylor, Lubbock, and Brown counties will be moved to this new territory which has been assigned a quota of 5,000 new members.

These western counties, together with the eleven black land units have a farm population of 92,865 and produce approximately in 1922 a little more than a million bales of cotton which is a greater production than any State in the cotton belt.
