WHAT IS DISEASE AND WHAT CAUSES IT

There has been an almost endless number of causes for disease expounded from time to time; but invariably only secondary and environmental or climatic causes have been mentioned.

The Primary cause of disease was discovered by an investigator in the city of Davenport, Iowa, in the year 1895. D. D.
