

Mexican residents of Texas who may be tempted from one cause or another to vote for Proxy Jim for Governor should bear in mind just what Ferguson's opinion is of the Mexican people. In his Forum of Thursday, December 16, 1920, over his signature, Ferguson made these statements:

"When thewar came on and we needed the Mexicans to help cultivate the country while our boys were in war nearly every mother's son of them hit the grit for Mexico and left us to help ourselves.

"Now when the war is over here they come back demanding one-third of our cotton for picking and murdering our citizens because somebody objected to the damn greasers riding in a coach with the white people.

"We have a separate coach law to separate white and black and to keep down trouble; the Mexican must be separated too. We are not going to give more privilege to the Mexican than we do to the nigger, who is far superior to the Mexican in every attribute that goes to make a good citizen.

"The Mexican people have not improved one bit in civilization and they are more bloodthirsty than ever. "The Mexican horder coming into this country must be stopped by law right now.

"If war should arise between this country and any other country, the Mexican would be against us every time that he thought he could put it over."

Jim Ferguson is asking for vindication of his name, after admitting the acceptance of around \$156,000 from the brewers of Texas during the time that legislation was before his administration objectionable to the manufacturers of liquor.

Vindication and forgiveness are one thing. Entrusting of the State's money, your money, and the handling of it, is another thing. No one would object to accepting the apology and forgiving another for a wrong, but certainly this vindication and forgiveness should not include allowing one to again place his hands on the State's money (in your pocket) and his opportunity to do so, if Mrs. Ferguson is elected, is infinitely greater than it was when he was Governor, and without the possibility of impeachment or conviction, since as a paid lobbyist, and also directing through Mrs. Ferguson the executive office, he can filch millions of dollars from the tax payers of Texas, directly and indirectly, and not be subject to charges of bribery because technically he would not be Governor, and would be filling the role of paid lobbyist, against whom there is no law.
