#### SAVE THE FEEDSTUFF

There is reason to believe that Texas and other Southwestern States will produce an abundance of feedstuff this season. A large oat crop has already been harvested. Hay and other forms of forage are making a better showing than for several years, and there is yet time for fall crops and fall pastures.

The Southwest has always been more prosperous when farmers have not had to spend their cotton money for feed, and this seems to be one of those years. 1 Next year may not prove so favorable, and therefore every pound of feed should be saved and that part not needed for immediate consumption should be stored against the time of need. If a farmer is without barn and shed room for his hay and other forage, select a well drained place and stack. Be sure your stack is well constructed and will shed water. If properly stacked after being properly cured, it will keep through the winter and for an almost indefinite time thereafter.

There is very little money in producing feed and selling it. One never receives for it as much as he would have to pay, if he were in need. An abundant supply of feed is more valuable on the farm than it is in the supply of feed is more valuable market .- Farm and Ranch.
