


The local show will begin at 6 p.m., and will start with heifer judging, followed by lambs, swine, and topped off by the Pee-Wee pig show.

Judging the local show will be Mark Edens, vo-ag instructor at Levelland.


A picnic table will be auctioned off by the Bovina FFA chapter, said Gary McPeak, ag instructor.
