There will be a baby shower for Tami Kunselman on Thursday, December 13 at 3 p.m. at the First State Bank in Bovina.

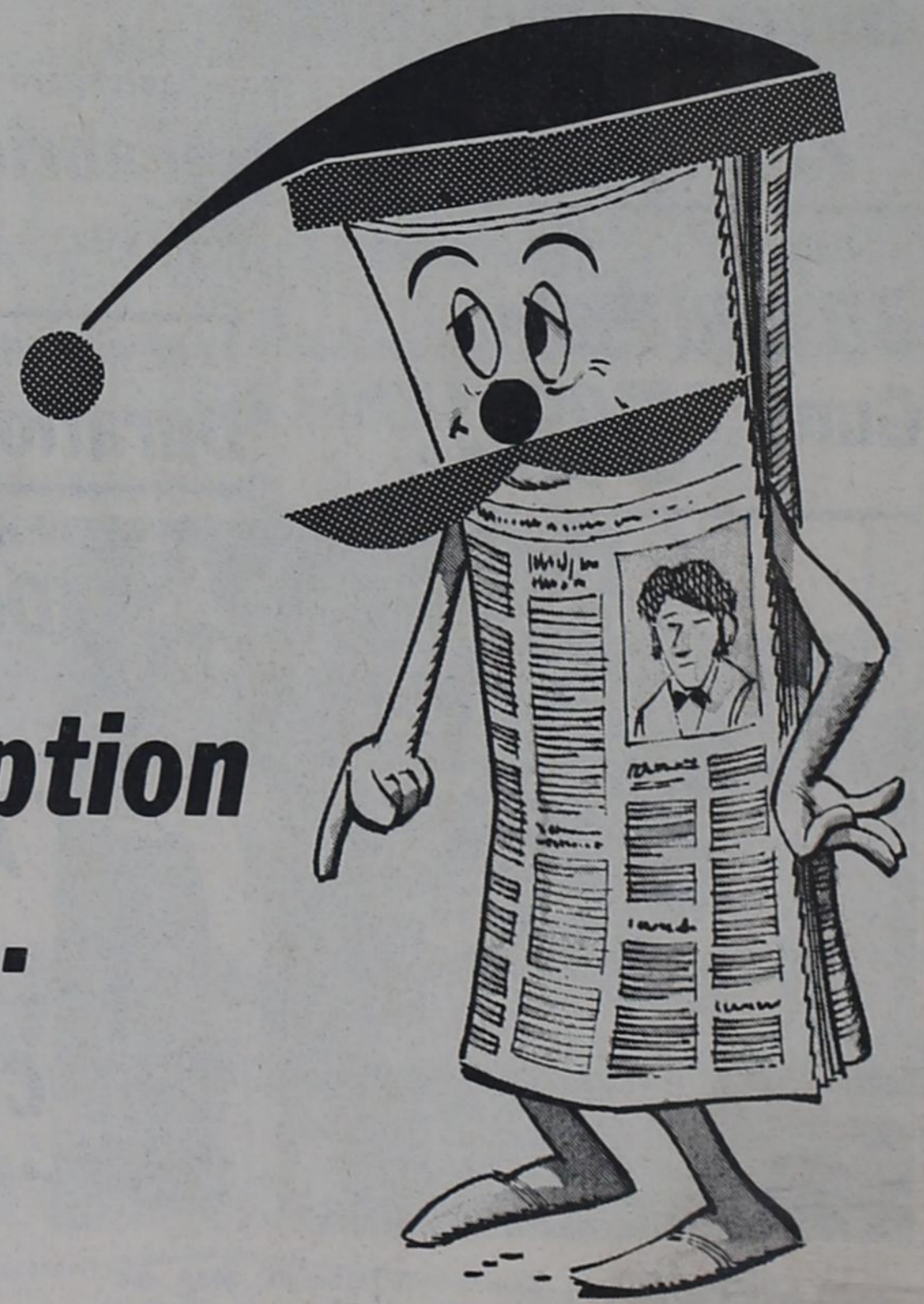
