Hance says that occasionally you
hear the statement, "Why don't we hear the statement, "Why don't just give the Shah back to them?' we open ourselves up to blackmail from every terrorist group in the world. This would cause us severe problems from now on," Hanc explained.

and his father before him had been supported by the United States for the past 25 years, and that the Shah had been a consistent, strong
supporter of the U.S. for all of that time. opinion the United States has to continue to harbor the Shah until such time as arrangements can be
made for him to go to another country.

have to work something out which will be suitable to the Shah, the United States and
countries," Hance said

on Monday, Hance said he believed the fact that the religious holidays are coming to a close in Iran migh indicate that something could b worked out within the next ten days. announced that if the hostages wer not released within ten days, the U.S would begin serious bids to overthrow the Khomeini government. "If the people of Iran have a
complaint against the Shah, they can complaint against the Shan, they can
go to the world court and file suit against him, to recover their money if in fact he took any illegally, Hance stated.
"There is only one issue involved in the matter, and that is that 50 people
are being held illegally, immorally and unethically; and it is against al types of law, domestic and international. To make a lot of talk
about anything else is to about anything else is to diver
attention from the main issue, Hance said.
The congressman said he had been proud of the way Congress had stood together, basically, during the crisis. He was critical of Senator Ted
Kennedy's remarks concerning the Kennedy's remarks concerning the
Shah, saying they were completely Shah, sayin
out of line.
"When you have a national crisis, you have to unite behind your leader. Now, we may disagree considerably
when we have closed-door sessions when we have closed-door sessions,
but when we walk out those doors, we have to act as a team," Hance remarked.
The Congressman said that there was the possibility that one thing
good had come out of the situation in good had come out of the situation in
Iran. "For the first time in 30 years, there is unification in America. I think we'll see a tougher foreign policy, and an increase in defense spending. This may work out to be a blessing in disguise, especially if we
get the hostages out unharmed," he get the hosta

9500 feet on the well, and that the las 2,000 feet would be the critical stage far as discovering oil was oncerned.
It is the first wildcat oil exploratio roject in the area in quite some time. The drilling is being done by American Petrofina, and is styled Baker and Taylor Drilling Co., Rig No. 9. It is located $141 / 2$ miles north of Bovina, just across th
