

Mustangs Smack Smyer 33-6, Look To Lorenzo Tonight

The Bovina Mustangs and Smyer Bobcats tied in one category Friday night: each team gathered 212 yards of offense during the 48-minute fracas.

Coach Scroggins grumbled about the 212 yard total, then reflected that "if we could have 212 yards and 33 points every game, I'd sure take it."

Contributing to the imbalance between total yards and the score was Bovina's defense that had two interceptions, stopped two punt attempts, and held Smyer to 121 yards rushing on 46 attempts and only 3 completions in 20 passing attempts.

Victor Banuelos was singled out by Coach Scroggins for his 9 points on the night with his significant contribution to the Mustangs success. "On two consecutive series", Scroggins Mustangs have allowed yardage."

The two interceptions were made by David 59 carries and 8 touchdowns Martinez and Lucas Ramos. so far. Quintana's totals are Also, senior Miguel Hernandez 309 yards on 56 carries and

Lucas Ramos delivered his usual power on offense. Early in the first quarter, Ramos exploded for an 80-yard touchdown run. He added a 5-yard touchdown after one of the forced punt turnovers.

Just before halftime, the all-district candidate calmly added his third touchdown of the first half on a 25-yard dash to the end zone. Ramos finished the evening with 123 yards on just 9 carries.



Last but not least, at last, Don Spring of Bovina stood alone in 3rd place at 13 points off and can spend the \$5 prize money.







Both the county junior winner and the county senior winner will be guests of the Amarillo Globe-News at a luncheon preceding the regional competition.


