replacement of old equipment and recruitment of more doctors and PAs have been the primary targets for both the hospital and clinics.
Parmer County Hospital and Parmer County Hospital and the
Rural Health Clinics are separate Rural Health Clinics are separate
entities, but they work together in entities, but they work together in
offering the finest possible health care to residents of this area.
Both administrators feel that the
recent re-opening of
recent re-opening of the Bovina
Clinic is a great stride forward in Clinic is a great stride forward in
offering better service to the people. offering better service to the people.
The hospital, being one of the largest employers in the county,
has 71 employees with a payroll of has 71 employees with a payroll of The Friona and Bovina Rural Heath Clinics employ 19 people,
including three doctors and two
PAs.
Dr. Bob Alexander is the
"granddaddy" of the physicians' "granddaddy" of the physicians'
staff, having been in Friona for staff, having been in Friona for
nearly 30 years. Physician's here two years. Dr. Felipe Jubay and Dr. Anthony Orme have both been with the staff for one year.
