 Combat EnergyCongressman Larry
Combest said that a quick way to cut down on the oil
shortage would be for producers who have wells currently not producing, or
"capped," to go in and get
such wells back into such we
production.

"There are some producers example, who already, have
some wells which have not some wells which have not or another, to get such wells
back in service," Combest said. The congressman was
speaking to a group of seven speaking to a group of seven
newspaper publishers and writers in a conference
telephone discussion this telephone discussion this
week. where there shauld be an
increase in oil and gas increase in oil and gas
production. This can be be
accomplished much quicker accomplished much quicker for oil and digging new
wells," Combest told the writers.
Combest slammed the environmentalists who are so loudly protesting drilling for
oil in Alaska's Anwar Region.
"This region contains some 19 "This region contains some 1 roughly the size of North
Carolina. The area which is
proposed for drilling, for proposed for drilling, for
comparision, is about the size
of the Dulles Airport in of the Dull
Washington.
But the pointed out that even should drilling in this potentially
good new site be approved,
there would have to be some
new pipelines built, and this
will take time, he said. will take time, he said. There is a huge amount of
natural gas which could be tapped into that could be a
big help, at least for the big help, at least for the
immediate future," he said. Combest pointed out that
the people in the Northeast the people in the Northeast are against any pipelines
being built across their states.
"But whenever their being built across their states.
"But whenever their rivers
and lakes freeze and supplies and lakes freeze and supplies
can't be shipped in, what do you do then?" he posed. in California's current probergy crunch, Combest said. Areas
of California have been opposed to large electric or
energy plants being built in their neighborhoods, and now
they're out of power. "There has not been a new
refinery built in the last 25 years, plus the fact that in that time a number of plants
have closed down. We need a have closed down. We need a
minimum of 200,000 miles of
delivery lines delivery lines, just to meet
the short-term need," Combest said.
The country could use 200 new plants per year for the
next 20 years, and still not next 20 years, and still not
have too many, the have too many, the
congressman said. In regard
to the escalating cost of gas to the escalating cost of gas at the pump, Combest said
there has been some evidence
of prices stabilizing to of prices stabilizing to some
