One of the areas in which it apparently rates the highest is in
climate and terrain. The chapter climate and terrain. The chapter enormous variety of climates from which to choose.
The nation's climates vary from northern maritime climates, southerly mountain climates,
lowland desert types, tropical "paradise" climates, subtropical climates, and extremely mild Mediterranean-type climates.
Many people have found that the weather profoundly affects our moods and emotions. Long, snowy
winters which keep you confined winters which keep you confined
indoors can have adverse emotional effects. Some people get irritable when the weather gets hot and they are unable to sleep well at night.
Due to the high cost of energy in regard to heating and cooling,
industries which are planning to relocate may base their decision more on the climate of a given area than on its proximity to major ransportation facilities.
Six criteria were used in the study on climate mildness: (1) very hot and very cold months; (2)
season temperature variation; (3) heating and cooling-degree days; (4) freezing days; (5) zero-degree days and (6) ninety-degree days. California cities completely dominated the top ten cities in the
study, in fact, the state swept the first 11 rankings. Washington and Oregon sites captured seven of the next eight rankings.
The only Texas location to be ranked in the top 20 was the
Galveston-Texas City area, which was 20th.

nation's mildest areas, and in the statistical study, the metropolitan area ranked 30th.
