A FATHER'S DAY gift this year which was of interest was the Rand McNally *Places Rated Almanac*, which is advertised as "Your guide to finding the best places to live in America."

The guide rates 329 metropolitan areas in the country, on such factors as climate and terrain, housing, health care and environment, crime, transportation, education, the arts, recreation, and the cost of living.

It has been fun to look through the book, and see how our "chosen area" rates, according to the various studies.

One of the areas in which it apparently rates the highest is in climate and terrain. The chapter points out that Americans have an enormous variety of climates from which to choose.

The nation's climates vary from northern maritime climates, southerly mountain climates, lowland desert types, tropical "paradise" climates, subtropical climates, and extremely mild Mediterranean-type climates.

Many people have found that the weather profoundly affects our moods and emotions. Long, snowy winters which keep you confined indoors can have adverse emotional effects. Some people get irritable when the weather gets hot and they are unable to sleep well at night.

Due to the high cost of energy in regard to heating and cooling, industries which are planning to relocate may base their decision more on the climate of a given area than on its proximity to major transportation facilities.

Six criteria were used in the study on climate mildness: (1) very hot and very cold months; (2) season temperature variation; (3) heating and cooling-degree days; (4) freezing days; (5) zero-degree days and (6) ninety-degree days.

California cities completely dominated the top ten cities in the study, in fact, the state swept the first 11 rankings. Washington and Oregon sites captured seven of the next eight rankings.

The only Texas location to be ranked in the top 20 was the Galveston-Texas City area, which was 20th.

However, we thought it encouraging that out of the 329 metropolitan areas which were rated, the Amarillo area was ranked 67th, and Lubbock was close behind at 70th.

The only Texas location to rank ahead of Amarillo and Lubbock on the climate study was the Galveston-Texas City area, already mentioned. Albuquerque, New Mexico is located (according to an accompanying map) in one of the nation's mildest areas, and in the statistical study, the metropolitan area ranked 30th.

The only other Texas places which made the study's "top 100" were Midland and Odessa which tied for 71st on the list, and El Paso, ranked 82nd.

Giving the study's validity a boost (from ye editor's point of view) was the fact that our state's larger metropolitan areas were ranked like this: Dallas and Fort Worth, tied for 186th; Houston, 287th, and San Antonio, 299th.

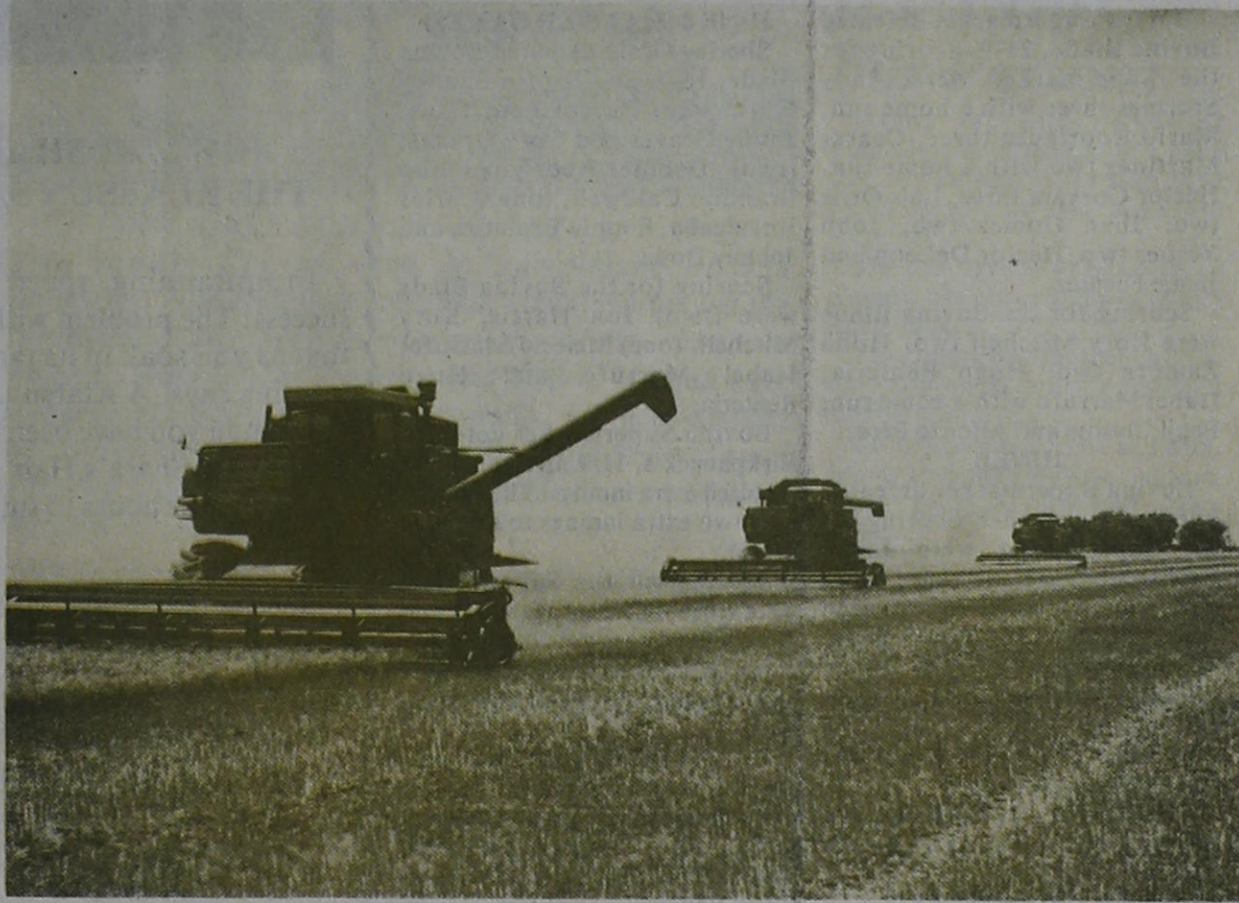
These weren't the lowest ranking Texas cities in the climate study. Killeen-Temple ranked 308th, Corpus Christi was number 309; Victoria was 313th, and the McAllen-Edinburg-Mission triangle came in 323rd, beating out Anchorage, Alaska by one place.

Two Minnesota spots, St. Cloud and Duluth, were at 324 and 325. The "bottom of the barrel," according to the study, were Bismark, N.D., 327; Fargo-Moorhead, N.D., 328, and Grand Forks, N.D., 329.

# Bumper Wheat Harvest Eyed

## Dryland Yields Are "Super"



**HARVEST IN FULL SWING...** The wheat harvest is in full swing in the area, and this year's crop is making banner yields, especially in the dryland fields. Most farmers are reporting better than average yields, and are hoping for a few more pretty days, so they can get the harvest over with.

Harvest of the wheat and barley is well underway in the Bovina area, with anxious farmers keeping an eye on the clouds while they go about their harvest work. Producers and elevator officials are geared for a bumper crop of wheat, much better than the yields of recent years.

Harry Johnson, office manager of Sherley Grain in Bovina, says he thinks the harvest right around Bovina is close to half complete. Harvesting has been slowed down for some due to showers in recent weeks. The area even received a shower of rain Monday evening.

Johnson said that of the wheat received by Sherley Grain, about half had been dryland, and half irrigated. The dryland wheat is much above average, with yields reported up to 60 bushels to the acre.

Some of the irrigated wheat also is producing records. Joe Steelman said the yield on his irrigated wheat was 79 bushels to the acre.

But some of the irrigated yields may be disappointing, Johnson said, due to the rust, which apparently affected the irrigated wheat the most. Johnson indicated that some fields might show a 20 per cent loss due to the rust. The rust disease was somewhat new to the area this year, and is thought to have been caused by the additional rain that the area received.

The yields in the Rhea community, which is mostly dryland wheat, have been described as "fantastic." Walter Schueler of Rhea said his dryland wheat was averaging 60 bushels per acre, a yield figure which hasn't been experienced by dryland farmers in a number of years.

Floyd Reeve farms a place at the "ten mile corner" north of town, and said that field, completely dryland, made 50 bushels to the acre. "Most years, that field is 'just there to hold the world together'," Reeve joked, saying this was by far the best yields he had had. His grandfather first farmed the place 50 years ago, Reeve said.

Wheat price locally was \$2.95 per bushel on Monday of this week. Everyone agrees that it is a shame that the price isn't better for the farmers, since the yields are so good for a change.

However, they can net \$3.09 per bushel if they go the government loan route, and can also get an additional premium if their wheat has good protein. Early indications are that the protein content of the 1985 crop may be good.

First load of barley was marketed locally by John Dixon, whose dryland crop was harvested on the Goolsby place five miles north of Bovina. The barley was cut on June 3.

Arnold Hromas had the first load of wheat delivered to Sherley Grain, on Saturday, June 8. The wheat had a moisture content of 14 per cent, and Hromas said he thought the field would average 30 bushels per acre.

## Plans Progressing For July 4 Program

The Bovina Chamber of Commerce announced this week that plans were well underway for the upcoming July Fourth celebration.

Activities planned are a Pet Show, musical entertainment, fireworks display and the Almost Anything Goes contest.

The Chamber urges persons interested in entering the competition to pick up entry forms at Bovina Supermarket as soon as possible.

The contest will be limited to ten teams with six members on each team. Events the teams will be competing in will be a pool shot, swing foot shot, six man sack race, watermelon eating contest, tractor tube race, Nerf ball bob and blind man wheelbarrow race.

The Chamber will have all necessary equipment set up at the football field at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, July 3. For a practice session, the teams may practice

from 5 p.m. until 9 p.m. that evening.

Preliminaries will start promptly at 4 p.m. on July 4, following the pet show. The final competition will be comprised of the top three teams and will begin at 8 p.m. at the football field. Entry fee is \$30 per team.

Team trophies will be presented to the first, second and third place teams with individual trophies awarded to each member of the winning team. The winning team will be guest of the "J-Team" show on KZZO Radio in Clovis on July 5.

The fireworks display will follow the "Almost Anything Goes" contest finals.

No admission will be charged for any of the July 4th activities. The Chamber is trying to raise money to help cover the cost of the fireworks by selling tickets on a set of patio furniture valued at \$1,600.

The charge will be \$5 per day for a booth and \$2.50 a day for electricity. Those arriving on Thursday night will be charged for Thursday as well as the other days.

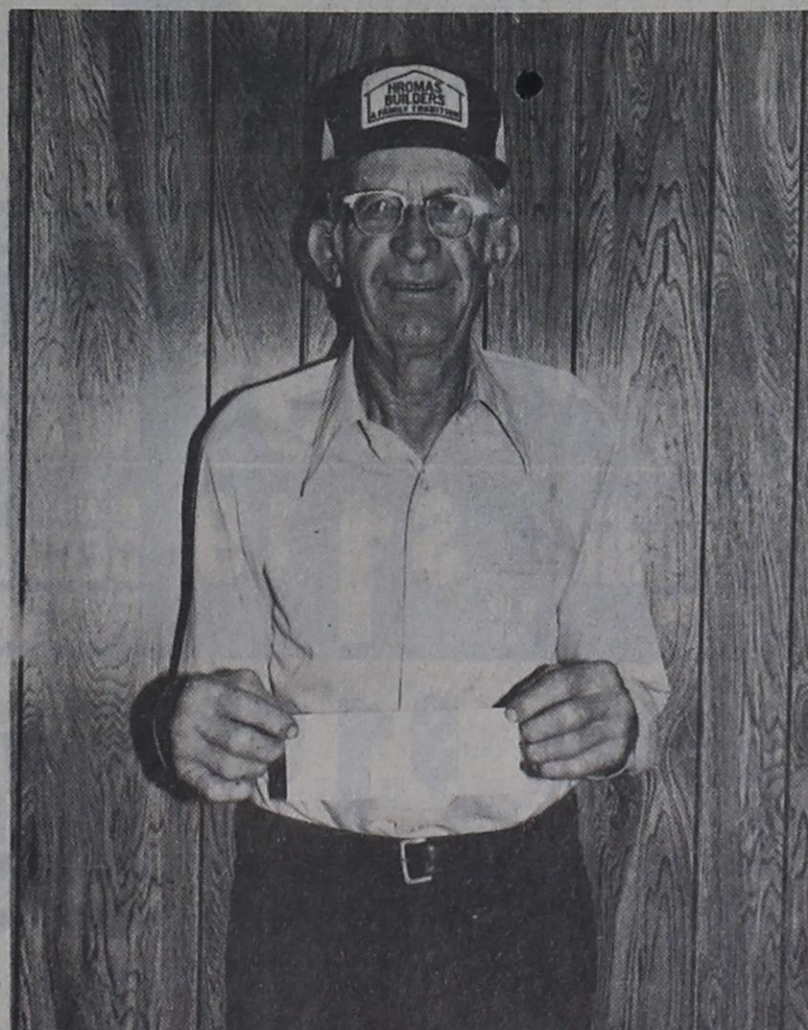
This is definitely a trial deal to see if Trade Days will continue, so everyone is invited to shop for good bargains on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

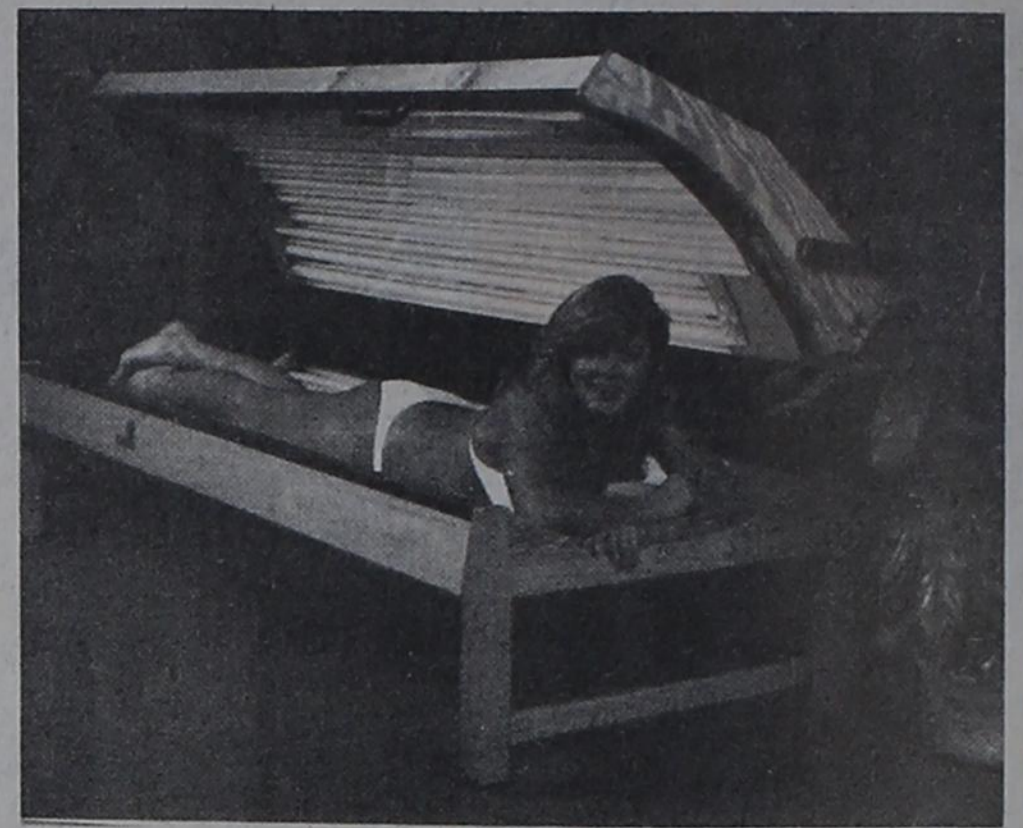

Bovina High School seniors returned from their senior trip Wednesday, June 5, to parts of California.

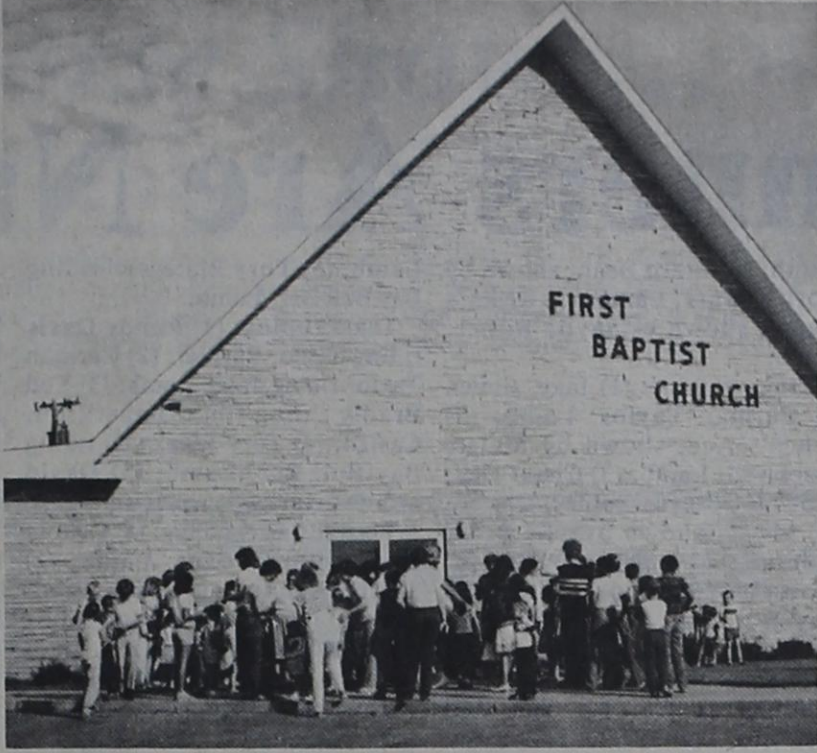
Seventeen seniors went and also sponsors, Coach and Mrs. Hill, Janie Sudderth and Melba Moore.

The couple has another child, a son, Jonathan, who is eighteen months old.

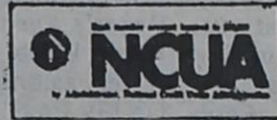
