



Here is a good lemon meringue pie you might try soon.

> Lemon Meringue Pie 9 inch pie shell, baked 7 tablespoons cornstrarch 112 cups sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 112 cups hot water eggs yolks

1/2 cup fresh lemon juice teaspoon grated lemon peel 2 tablespoons butter of margar

Mix cornstarch, sugar and salt in saucepan. Stir in hot water gradually and bring to boil over direct heat; then cook for 8 to 10 minutes over medium heat, stirring constantly until thick and clear. Remove from heat. Stir several spoonfuls of this hot mixture into beaten egg yolks; mix well. Pour egg yolks back into saucepan. Bring to boil, then cook over low heat for 4 to 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat: gradually add lemon juice, lemon peel and butter. Cool filling; pour into cooled baked pie shell. Top
