With the snow also came cold temperatures, although the readings weren't nearly as low as they were earlier in the month, when the 14 -inch snow was received. The low readings got into the teens several mornings, before finally

The warmup continued last week, with the high temperature reaching into the mid-50s on Wednesday, December 30 .
However, the New Year's weekend was cold, and a new cold front invaded the area on Monday, January 4. The latest front brought sub-freezing temperatures with chill factor near zero and the threat of snow on Tuesday.
