

Three BHS Players Named All-District


Three members of the Bovina Mustangs' District and Bi-District championship team have been named first team all-district.


Those selected to represent the Mustangs were seniors Billy Scott Sudderth, Denver Riddle and Scott Scaff. *****

On Scaff's team are six all-stars from Fort Worth, one from Big Spring, one from Lubbock, and






