## MERKELITES VOTE IN FAVOR OF ISSUE

Voters here Saturday approved by more than a 6 to 1 margin proposals for issuance of \$155,000 in bonds for construction of a new sewer system.

The vote was 203 for and 32 against \$100,000 in revenue bonds and 202 for and 32 against \$55,000 in tax bonds.

The U.S. government has approved a grant of \$64,000, provided the city furnishes the balance of the cost, estimated at approximately \$219,000.

Revenue bonds will be payable solely from earnings of the water and sewer system and the \$55,000 in general obligation bonds will be payable from taxes.

The standard procedure after the election is a 30 day stand-still before construction.

## New Power Plant To Open Today

The newest power plant in West Texas and one of the most modern in Texas will be open to the general public for the first time, Thursday afternoon, September 26 from 1:30 to 6:30 p.m.

WTU's Oak Creek Power Plant located on Oak Creek Reservoir between Blackwell and Bronte, has scheduled a Visitation Day for West Texans.

The plant's chief engineer, R. E. Patton, today issued an invitation to West Texas families to visit the plant and see how electrical energy is generated. Patton said guided tours will be conducted for the visitors. The tours will take from 25 to 30 minutes. Each tour will be conducted by power plant personnel who can answer questions concerning the plant and its operation.

Patton pointed out that the Visitation Day is to be an informal affair. Refreshments have been planned for the visitors and it is hoped they will remain on the grounds to meet and visit with the plant personnel.

The Oak Creek Plant is located on Highway 70, one mile north of the intersection of Highways 70 and 277. The plant site is

about midway between San Angelo and Abilene. The plant, which is the newest in WTU's system, is interconnected with 138,000 volt transmission lines with other plants in the WTU system. High voltage transmission lines from the plant carry electric power north to the Abilene area, east to the Ballinger area, and south to San Angelo.

## Safety Stickers Now Available

AUSTIN (Special to the Merkel Mail) — Col. Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, has announced that the 1964 vehicle inspection sticker became available September 1 at all Official Inspection Stations in Texas.

"During the summer months, the department has conducted intensive re-training schools for all owners and mechanics of inspection stations," Garrison said. "These men are now qualified and they are ready to serve the motoring public in their vehicle inspection needs."

More than five million vehicles registered in the state are required by law to be inspected at one of the 5,000 official stations between now and April 16, 1964. Operators of vehicles not displaying the new sticker by that date will be in violation of the law.

Garrison urged motorists to get their vehicles inspected at the earliest possible time and pointed out:

"Since the vehicle inspection program began in Texas, vehicle

defects as causative factors in motor vehicle accidents has been reduced from 13 per cent in 1951 to five per cent in 1962. We have every reason to hope that with continued voluntary compliance

with this law, accidents can be further reduced."
