Regarding the above statement about you not going into the field of drug dealing, I think that should be self-explanatory to anyone with a 12th grade education, so I'll not expound any further on that point.



## Mustangs Fall 4-1 To Loraine In Area Play

The Bovina Mustangs made just a few defensive mistakes in its area playoff game at Chaparral Stadium in Lubbock Tuesday, but that was just enough to give the Loraine Bulldogs a 4-1 victory.

The Mustangs were leading in the game, 1-0, entering the bottom of the fifth inning, but the Bulldogs took the lead with a pair of unearned runs in the fifth, and then padded their margin with two more unearned runs in the sixth inning.

The District 2-1A runnerup Mustangs, who finished with a 4-18 record for the year, made three errors in the game, two in the fifth inning and one in the sixth. This was Bovina's first year to play baseball in high school since 1978.

Loraine righthander Chris Phillips (7-0), who had pitched a one-hitter in the Bulldogs' 12-0 bi-district victory against Eula, went the distance and allowed only four singles. He walked one and struck out seven.

"This wasn't one of our better games," said Phillips. "Not at all. We couldn't hit anything. We're usually a pretty good hitting team. Maybe we got a little cocky after our last game."

Bovina starter Isabel Marrufo (2-9) allowed four hits and a walk while striking out five in 5-1/3 innings.

The Mustangs have played some extremely close games throughout the season, and with a break here and there, could just as easily have finished the season with a winning record.

## Fire Department Answers Fifteen Calls During May

The month of May is almost over and it's been mostly hot and dry, like most months, until recently. With so much land in CRP and the wheat fields beginning to dry, the hot weather is the fire fighters' most dreaded time. Since January 1992, we have been called to nine rural fires, four town fires and two weather watches.

The Texas Forest Service has donated a 5,000 gallon water tanker to held with rural fires. They also helped in getting ten new suits of bunker gear for us. We hope to get twelve more new suits so that all 22 members of the Bovina Volunteer Fire Department will have new bunker gear.

During our fire meeting of May 11, twelve members attended a class at Rhea Community Center pertaining to F-111 aircraft. The Rhea-Hollene Fire Department and Cannon Air Force Base hosted this class discussing the dangers involved if a F-111 was to crash in our area.

The firemen would most likely be the first to the scene, not knowing what dangers lie ahead--until our class on the subject. The F-111 carries many incendiary devices which can kill a person if he gets too close, not to mention what would happen if he was to step on or drive across one.

## Men Who Beat Their Wives

What kind of person beats up his wife? Are they naturally cruel people? Is this behavior learned? These are hard questions. The batterer rarely admits to having a problem much less being cruel. To most people he is a nice guy. The wife-beater can come from any walk of life.

The batterer often feels helpless, fearful, inadequate, and insecure. He is normally angry with himself about his life. He may think he is a loser so beating his wife is one way to appear to be a winner. He thinks even though he can't control things around him, he will control his wife! Violence is usually a response to the stress in a person's personal life.


The practiced batterer knows how to aim his blows in places that will not show. I've heard of wives/partners being beaten for breaking an egg yolk while cooking, for not giving him the first piece of dessert, cooking a dish he didn't like, for something someone on the job did to him, and wearing her hair in a pony tail.

Battering husbands often have been battered children or witnessed violence between their parents as young children. Some think it is mainly the lower-class families who experience family violence. They may have fewer resources and less privacy, and are more apt to contact police agencies who compile statistics.

Some feel alcohol is the problem. It may be a factor but not the problem. A person, who is potentially violent, can drink with the sole purpose of laying the blame for his actions on alcohol. The family and society will have the tendency to believe that the intoxicated person is not fully responsible

## SBA Loans Available In Area

Walter Fronstin, district director of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) in Lubbock announced recently that SBA is accepting applications for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) from eligible small business concerns and small agricultural cooperatives located in several West Texas counties which are serviced by the Lubbock office.

Businesses located in the following counties have until December 10, 1992 to file an EIDL application: Bailey, Cochran, Cottle, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Knox, Lamb, Motley, Parmer, Terry and Yoakum.

Businesses seeking loan information and loan applications may call, toll-free, 1-800-473-0477.

Fronstin said applicants must have sustained substantial economic injury because of their dependence upon farmers and ranchers who suffered agricultural damages. The agricultural damages were caused by extreme freezing weather conditions which occurred between October 1 and December 31, 1991.

To qualify for EIDL loans, applicants must be unable to secure financing from other sources and must be considered small by SBA size standards.

This loan program is intended to assist agriculture-dependent businesses and small agriculture cooperatives who sustained a substantial decrease in sales (or other forms of economic injury) directly due to losses incurred by farmers and ranchers to whom the businesses usually sell.



The Parmer County Special Education Advisory Board met in the Special Education Center Offices, May 20 at 2:30 p.m.

Present were members, Charles Turner, Christine Cupit, Lucille Franse, Diane Hernandez and Carl Martin.

Turner began the meeting with an introduction of members present. He then presented a cumulative report on special education services and trends for the current year.

Following the report, Judge Cooper, orientation and mobility specialist, and Chris Welker, technical assistant and computer specialist, Region XVI Education Service Center, Amarillo, presented a program regarding the delivery of services to visually impaired and blind students in Texas, current technology being implemented in service generation to the visually impaired and blind in Texas, including the Panhandle area, and trends for the future.

A question and answer session followed the program.

Herbert and Cecelia Schueler of the Rhea Community, teaches science, chemistry and physics at FHS. This year, one of the students in her class was her own younger brother, Jeff Schueler, who is a member of the graduating class of '92.





## Looking Up!

Summer vacation time is here! It's good for families to get away and spend some time with each other. Why, even our Lord and His disciples took some vacation time! The gospel of Mark records at least four such occasions during Christ's three and one-half year public ministry.

For example, in Mark 6:31-32, Jesus commanded His men, "Come apart with me alone to a quiet place and get some rest." So they went off by themselves in a boat to a solitary place." Of this passage, the late evangelist, humorist Vance Havner use to say with dry wit, "If you don't do as Jesus says and 'come apart', you will come apart!"

Well, before you or your family "comes apart", a nice vacation can ease a lot of tension and provide a change of pace. As Jesus indicated, we all occasionally need some rest for our spirits, souls, and bodies.

Jesus' vacation itineraries varied. Twice He went across the lake of Galilee in a boat, to the southern shore once, and once to the east side (Mark 4:35-5:20 and 6:31ff). Another time He traveled to the sea coast of Phoenicia near Tyre and Sidon (Mark 7:24ff.). Can't you just see Simon Peter and the others running along the beach, shouting and laughing as Jesus watched with a twinkle and grin!

His last vacation trip found Him and The Twelve in the high country north of Caesarea Philippi, staying cool near Mt. Hermon (the probable Mt. of Transfiguration), 9000 feet above sea level (Mark 8:27-9:29).

The reasons for our Lord's recreational breaks are similar to our own reasons for taking vacations. First and foremost, Jesus and His men needed rest. Jesus' daily schedule kept them all wary and tired. Jesus often arose early, traveled miles by foot, taught and ministered for hours, and retired late (Mark 1:32-39 for example).

Ministering and teaching can be very emotionally exhausting, sapping one's spiritual strength (see Mark 5:30). Times of spiritual, emotional, and physical renewal away from the daily grind are essential to us all!

Another reason for Jesus's retreats was to get out of the heat. The Mid-Eastern sun can really blaze down during the scorching summer months. Even Jesus often became tired and thirsty, such as the day he sat down at a Samaritan well and asked a woman from the local village for a drink of water (see John 4:7). A trip to the mountains, or across the lake, or to the sea coast can certainly be refreshing after weeks of hard, hot, dusty work. Just ask any West Texas farmer!

At times Jesus also desired to escape the ever present crowds that thronged Him wherever He went. Fame at times, I am told, can be a heavy burden, even to the point that Jesus and His band could not even find time to eat (Mark 3:20 and

6:31). We all know that during busy times it is hard to meet everyone's needs, meet all the deadlines, keep everything on schedule, and satisfy every request. People and work demand time! Sometimes even while on vacation, duty calls (Mark 7:24-25).

And don't forget that Jesus and The Twelve were continually hounded and under surveillance by their enemies, both religious (as the Pharisees in Mark 3:22, 8:11) and political (King Herod, Mark 6:14ff.). Sometimes it is nice to get away from folk, both friends who demand much, and acquaintances who are constantly on our case!

Finally, Jesus just needed some time alone with those who meant the most to Him. He desired some quality time, uninterrupted to teach His followers (Mark 4:34; 8:31) and let them get to know Him and each other better. One of the great blessings of vacation is renewing of relationships with those we love most, and spending some fun time together as a family.

For these reasons and others, I hope you'll take that vacation time you and your family need. Jesus did! It will keep you looking up!
