The Texas Department of Public Safety would like to urge all licensed drivers， 14 and 15 years of age with a restricted driver＇s li－ cense，who have completed both phases of a Driver Education Course，to be sure and go
to your nearest Driver＇s License Office and to your nearest oriser＇s hicense restriction removed before August 28 ．

The new Drivers License Law age chang－ es go into effect on that date．

If the dirvers who license is restricted to having a licensed driver 21 years of age or older in the front seat，fails to beat the August
28 deadline they will have to wait until their 16th birthday．This information is for the benefit of the recent graduates of driver ed－ ucation course．

## Center to Help

Improve plants
The job of the SCS plant materials centers is to find, evaluterials centers is to pind, evaluate and put into use better plants to solve varied soil and water conservation problems, accordin to H. N. Smith, state conser-
vationist. vationist.
Plant materials being used include seed, sprigs and rootstock. Some 850 varietie of plants are being evaluated, including grasses, legumes, forbs and woody plants. Some 95 other grasses are also being evaluated, including Kleingrass, Old World bluestem, buffalograss, (W 2, hybrid), Aribuffalograss, (W 2, hybrid, Arizona cottontop, Lehmann lovegrass and Whiplash pappusgrass. Native selections of shrubs, forbs and legumes are "being tested for conservation use and
food value for deer, quail, turkey food value for deer,
and other wildlife."
and other wildlife."
Turfgrasses resistant to heavy foot traffic are being studied for climatic adaptions. "These grasses are important for lawns, commercial developments, parks and other recreational uses."

## SCS ADMINISTRATOR DEDICATION SPEAKER

The Soil Conservation Service Plant Materials Center at Knox City will be dedicated today with the dedication program beginning at 11 a.m.
Plans for the dedication were announced by H. N. Smith, State Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service, Temple.
Donald A. Williams, SCS administrator, Washington, D.C. will be the key speaker and Smith

will be master of ceremonies. Williams has been administrator of the Soil Conservation Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, since 1953.
He joined the Soil Conservation Service in 1935 as a Civilian Conservation Corps Camp superintendent. From 1935 to 1947 he held field and regional SCS jobs held field and regional SCS jobs as a conservation engineer with emphasis on water conservation and irrigation.
He was SCS assistant regional director in the Pacific Coast Region from 1947 to 1950; flood control survey officer, Office of the Secretary of Agriculture, 1950-51; assistant SCS Chief, 1951-53; and was appointef administrator in November 1953.
He received the Distinguished Service Award of the National Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts in 1957, and the Distinguished Service Award of the U.S. Department of Agricul. ture in 1958.
Mr. Williams received his B.S. degree in civil engineering from South Dakota State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts in 1928. He is a charter member of the Soil Conservation Society of America.
